On 1st august 2019, the department of B.com Generals/ Business Studies had conducted an industrial visit to RC COLA, Pattancheru for the final year students which consisted of 52 students in collaboration with Acumen connect.

We started from college at 9:50 am and reached the industry at 11:00 am. Then, we were introduced about the RC COLA. We were divided into 2 groups. Before entering into the industry, we had a photo session. The industry was divided into different stages according to the stages of production. Before entering in any of the stage of production, our instructors gave us the information about that particular stage of the production. We saw the filtration process of water, use of sugar, manufacturing of RC COLA bottles with the raw materials of the bottle, giving that particular shape to the bottles, filling, labeling and packaging of the bottles. After that we saw how they use the waste materials again for earning and utilization of that waste material. At the end we got some samples of RC COLA to taste. The industrial visit was for 3hours. After the visit we went for lunch and came back to the college.
