Date: 28th July 2021 –30th July 2021

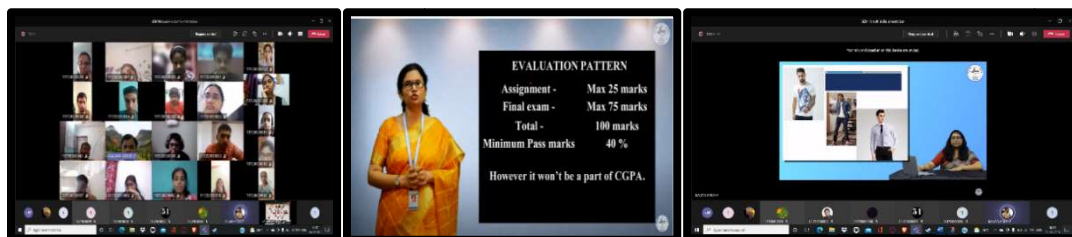
Platform: Microsoft Teams

He is also a Macro economics enthusiast who keeps a track of all the current happenings in the world. He works as a Volunteer at 'Make A Difference', for a social cause, in teaching English subject to 10th Grade students.

The webinar commenced with the introduction of the resource person and his experience in the world of stocks he further started with the introduction to the share market.

The stock market allows numerous buyers and sellers of securities to meet, interact, and transact. Stock markets allow for price discovery for shares of corporations and serve as a barometer for the overall economy. The primary market is where a company gets registered to issue a certain amount of shares and raise money. This is also called getting listed in a stock exchange. In a primary market, investors are able to purchase securities directly from the issuer. Stock exchanges instead represent secondary markets, where investors buy and sell from one another.

Once new securities have been sold in the primary market, these shares are traded in the secondary market. Secondary market transactions are referred to trades where one investor buys shares from another investor at the prevailing market price or at whatever price the two parties agree upon.

The lecturer mentioned the importance for you to be familiar with the stock exchanges and their functions. Stock exchange is where buying and selling of shares take place. The stock exchanges are regulated by SEBI (Securities and Exchange Board of India). The 2 important stock exchanges of India are NSE (National Stock Exchange) and BSE (Bombay Stock Exchange).

We also came to know about Bombay Stock Exchange was formally organised in the year 1875. It was earlier known as Native Share and Stockbrokers Association. It is the oldest stock exchange in Asia. It is the first exchange to be recognised under the Securities Contract (Regulation) Act in 1956.

The session also provided information on the Security board of exchange also known as SEBI which is the main regulator of stock exchanges in India. It was enacted on April 12, 1992 under the SEBI Act 1992. The prime objective of SEBI is to protect the interest of investors and to promote and develop the securities market in India. All financial intermediaries, whether domestic or foreign, who participates in the Indian securities market are governed by the SEBI regulations

Learning Outcome: The webinar enabled the participants in understanding the meaning of stock market ,types of market ,how to invest in the market and an overview of stocks exchange in India.

6.INDUSTRIAL VISIT

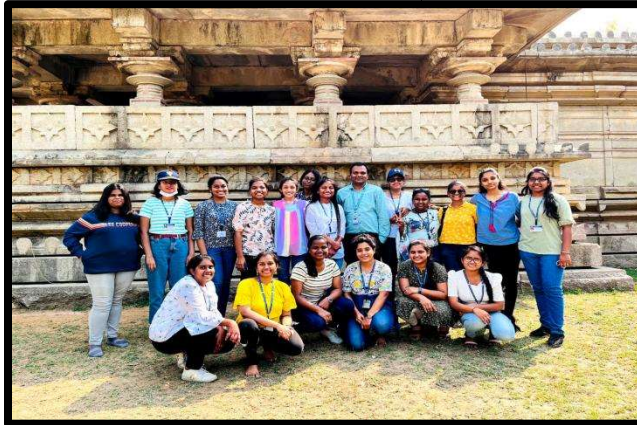

He is 67 years by age and much less by spirit.

Session on Skill Development and Business Analytics:

The first session was on the topic Skill Development and Business Analytics which was rendered by Dr. Chandrashekhar Menon

Dr. Chandrasekhar, in his session, emphasized the importance of staying current, stating the redundancy of past education in the current corporate workspace.

He urged the students to change along with the world, and emphasized on the fact that degrees only fetch interviews, not jobs and only knowledge and skill can create opportunities for career success.

He explained about VUCA that is Volatility, Uncertainty, Complexity, and Ambiguity.

He likened the brain of a human to a black box that records everything the person sees, does or learns. He conveyed the necessity to control this black box and the need to guide it towards productive ventures.

He also spoke about ‘the industries of the future - BUSINESS ANALYTICS and ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE’ conveying their importance in the business world and the opportunities they provide for young graduates and students.

He concluded stating that the students must always strive to improve themselves, learn and up-skill to be relevant in the corporate race and appreciated the department for taking this initiative.

Accountant in business is one of the initial subjects of ACCA and the department of B.com IAF has arranged a guest lecture for this subject for the students studying in the 1st year of the department.

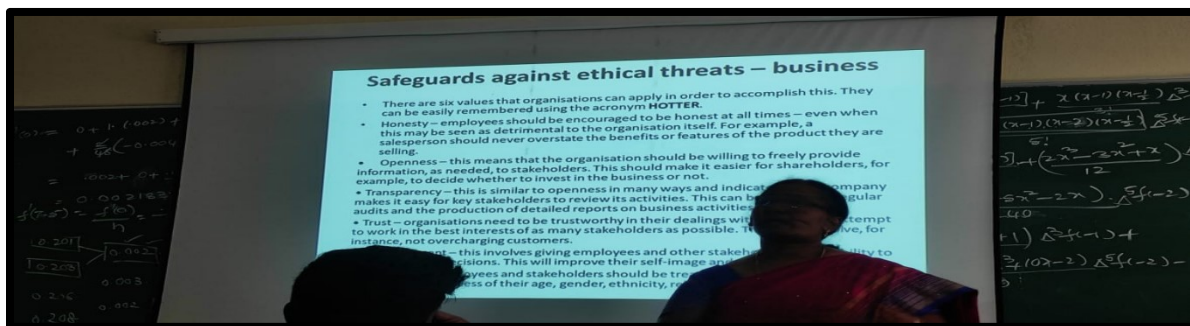

Total no. Of hours taken: 42 (Online: 6 Hours; Offline:38 Hours)

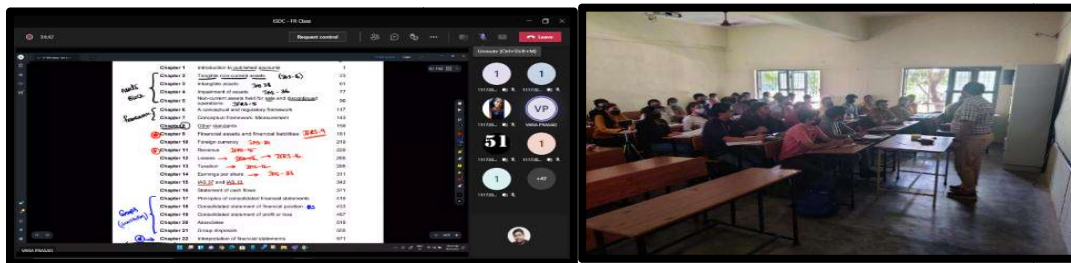
Report:

Report:

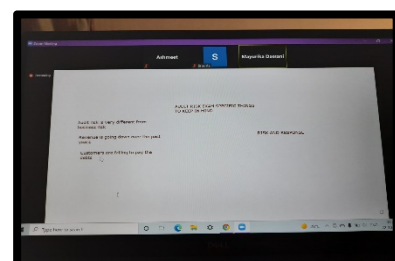
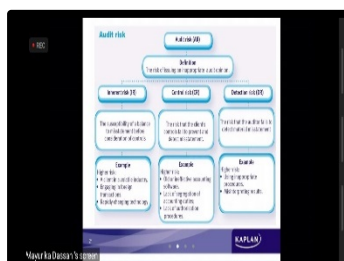

Advanced Performance Management (APM) is one of the Professional-Essential level papers of ACCA, the department of B. Com IAF had organized for guest lectures for the subject Advanced Performance Management for the 3rd year students of the department (DIAF).

The Advanced Performance Management exam is designed to reflect the strategic role of management accounting as a discipline for planning and controlling performance so that strategic objectives can be set, monitored and controlled. It recognizes the impact of external factors on strategic management issues and covers the risks these factors present and how they can be measured and managed.

The session started off with the guest lecturer introducing herself and enlightening the students with her 25 years teaching experience. She further started with the subject and gave insights about the importance of the subject and its requirements. She dealt with strategic planning and control and the impact of risk and uncertainty.

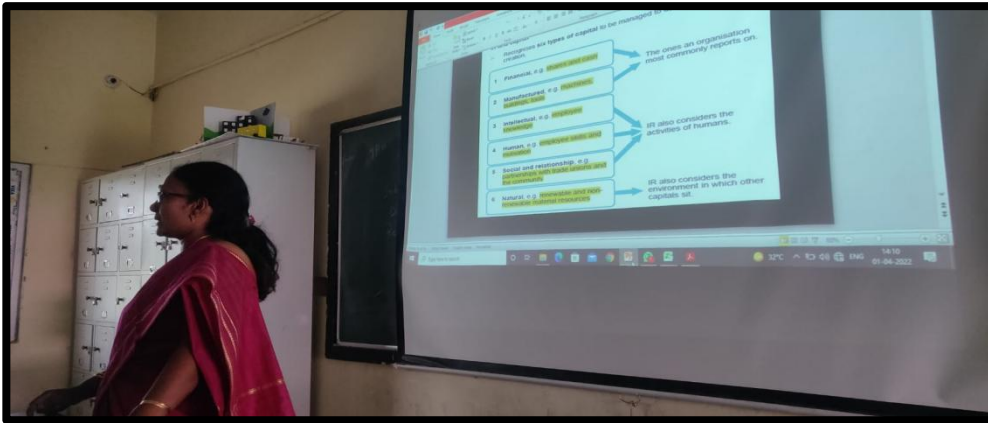
She also demonstrated how to appropriately apply strategic performance measurement techniques and how to evaluate strategic business performance.
