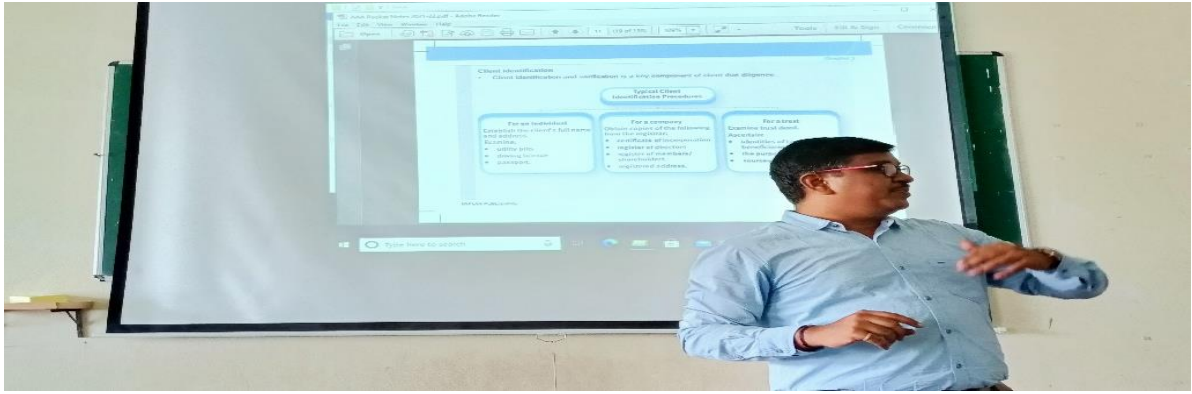
The session commenced with the guest lecturer sharing his experience and provided with few tips and tricks on how to strategize, plan and excel at Audit & Assurance exam. This helped the students to plan out their schedule and to competitively start preparing for the upcoming quarterly exam. The F8 paper deals with case studies and objective test questions which were undertaken by the lecturer after finishing the concept to have an in-depth knowledge about the concept and to be able to deal with exam-oriented questions.

During the sessions after the completion of the concept or a chapter, the students are given MCQ assignment on the LMS which are evaluated instantly and gives result on the candidates' performance. Also, a walk through through LMS was given to navigate the resources.

The classes also provide a platform to clarify doubts directly with the guest lectures in the class or through LMS. This communication helps a student to attempt paper with clarity of topic.

This session was helpful and explanatory to the students in understanding the dept of the subject and the concepts of Auditing & Assurance. 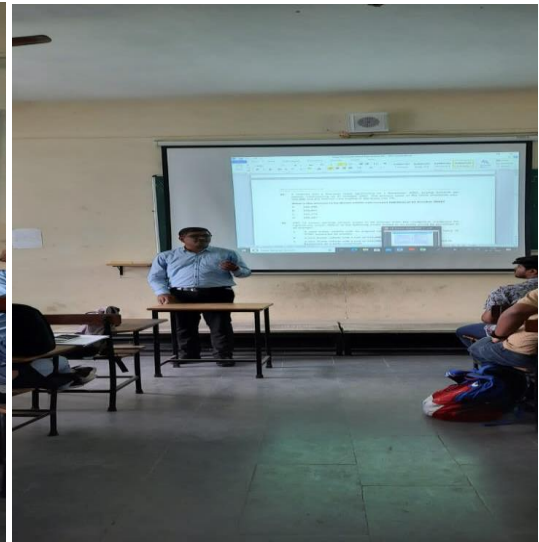
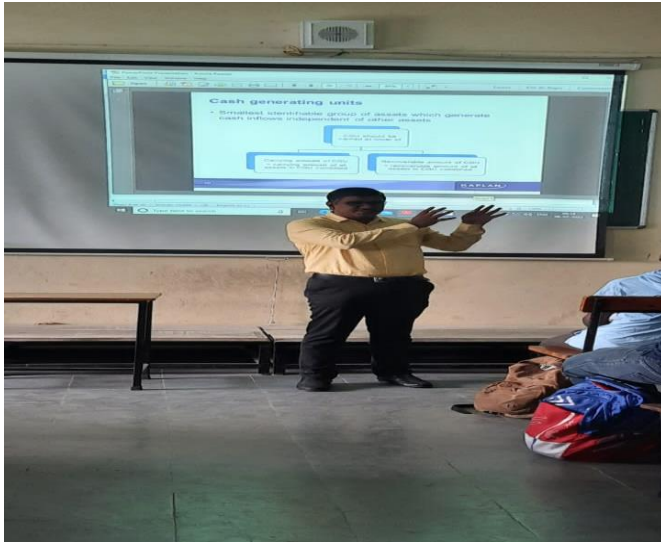

After the completion of each concept in depth the students were asked by the lecturer to solve the previous mock test papers and exam kit problems so that the students would be thorough and perfect in the concept. Later the students were requested to write the mock exams conducted in the ISDC platform, where the evaluation was done instantly and also provided with the key to improve and common errors made by the students were explained in detail. After the completion of the session the students were also provided assignment to solve which were evaluated and gives the result on the individual performance. 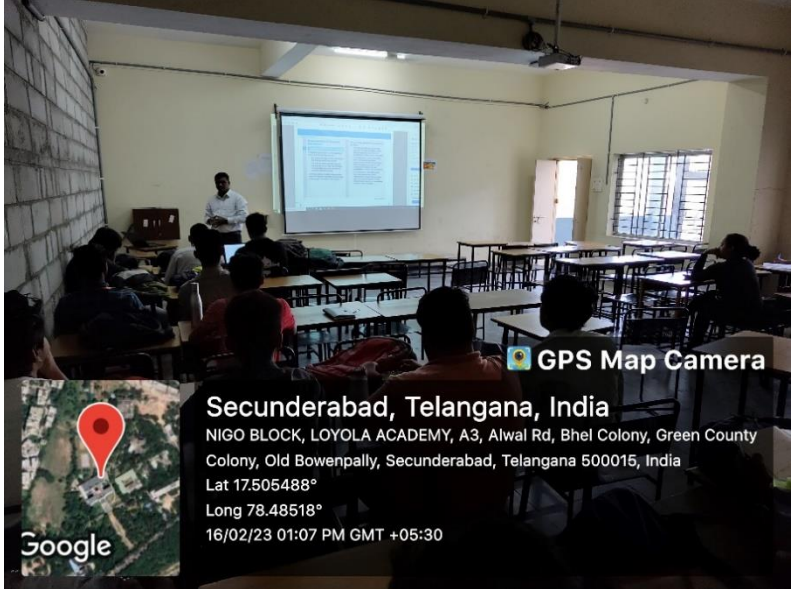
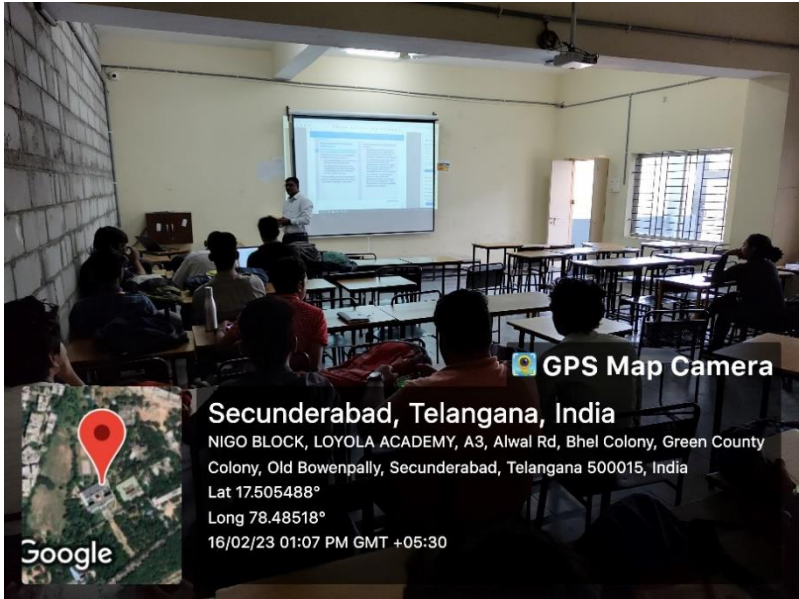
Strategic Business Reporting subject requires the students to demonstrate their ability to make strategic business reporting decisions. In SBR the students will need to link accounting issues to relevant concepts in practical situations. As well as demonstrating a sound understanding of the specific technical knowledge related to group financial statements, the students will also need to exercise professional and ethical judgement.

The sessions started off with the Guest lecturer introducing himself and enlightening the students with his 13 years teaching and acquainting himself with the students and their future goals. He further started with the subject and gave insights about the importance of the subject and its requirements. He dealt with various IFRS and IAS standards and also illustrated on how a professional and ethical judgement is given on various case studies.

The lecturer simplified the subject by defining each concept with its own tips and tricks to make it easier for the student to remember while also making an interesting environment for students to have fun and learn. During the sessions the lecturer also dealt with many current real-life cases and issues in the field of accounting and ACCA.

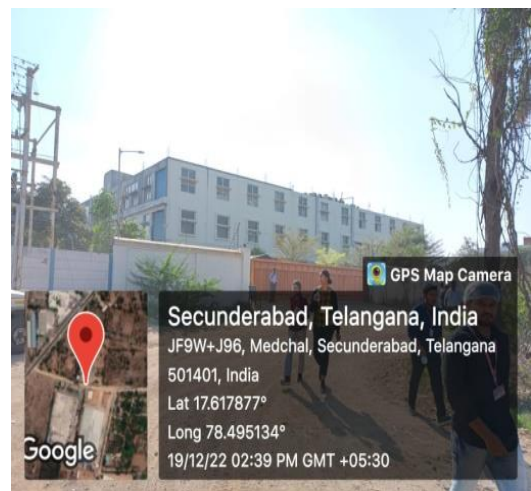

DAY – I

The first session was on the topic PERSONAL FINANCE & FINANCIAL LITREACY which was conducted by Dr. ABHISHEK MAHESHWARI. The session was interactive and insightful with the speaker giving a few practical examples related to the management of personal finance to the students. Furthermore, there was a briefing related to investment of money in various securities & financial markets. The session was concluded with a Q&A session where the speaker interacted with students and gave them keen insight into the world of personal financial management.

LEARNING OUTCOME: -

The students were able to comprehend the various financial instruments in the markets and were enlightened on how to save and manage their finances once they enter the corporate world.

Then the session moved into the events conducted by the department, the events of the day were AUCTION ACTION & AD-MAD.

AUCTION ACTION – “A Competition that checks participants' financial management skills can be a unique and challenging experience. In this type of competition, participants would need to demonstrate their ability to manage their finances, assess the value of the managers being auctioned, and make smart bidding decisions”.

AD-MAD – “It is a fun and challenging competition wherein participants create and present advertisements for a product or service. The event is designed to test the participants' creativity, marketing skills, and ability to communicate the value of the product or service through visual media and embrace the uniqueness of their product and convey it to the viewers”.

DAY – II

SESSION I Speaker: - **MR. SAI MANIKANTA PEDAMALLU, Founder of Global Finex, Hyderabad**

The first session was on the topic MONEY MANAGEMENT which was rendered by MR. SAI MANIKANTA PEDAMALLU. The session was on the compounded interest rates being charged on the loans with a practical example on calculation of house loan for a period of 20 years. The session gradually moved towards investments where he gave his insights on how to invest by analyzing the past and present performance of a company. There were many live examples especially about the recent scenario of Adani groups.

LEARNING OUTCOME: -

The students were able to evaluate investment options and strategies, understand the risks and benefits associated with different types of investments, and develop a diversified investment portfolio that aligns with their goals and risk tolerance and also had an insight view about loans and the interest rates being charged.

SESSION II Speaker: - DR. ABHISHEK MAHESHWARI

The second session started with an introduction into the intuition of an ACCA member and the career opportunities through ACCA. There was then a briefing on the description of the course then he explained the papers to be cleared in F-LEVEL & P-LEVEL and the paper pattern.

The students were able to clarify their doubts on ACCA and helped them to get an intuition on the career opportunities they want to pursue through ACCA.

SESSION III Speaker: - NAMALA ANIL KUMAR DORA (IIM), Operational Manager at Wells Fargo

This session was for the students who wanted to pursue their higher studies in India and Abroad. This was purely an interactive session where students raised their queries on higher education. Subsequently there was a briefing given related to the startups and tactics to attract investors towards their project.

The session moved into the events conducted by the department. The events of the day were COPORATE COUTURE & IDEATHON (conducted by WE-HUB)

DAVID who spoke about idea generation and various ways on how WEHUB aids entrepreneurs in growing their startups and attracting investors to get subsidies from the government. 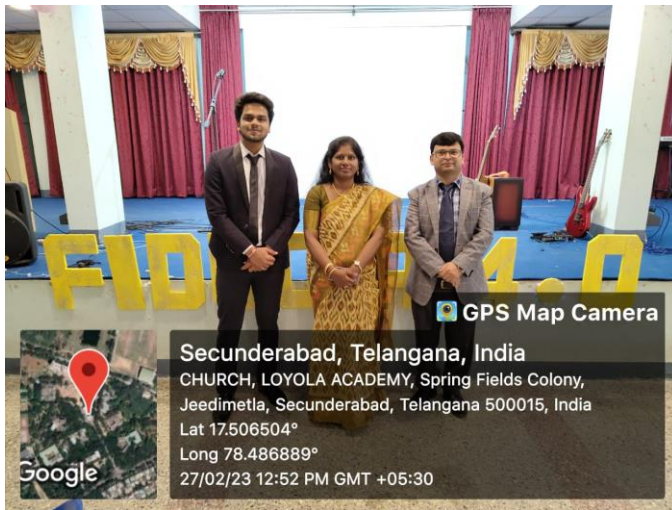
Valedictory:
