REPORT OF LITERARY & BOOK CLUB

The literature and book club provides the young minds with a platform to explore the world of the written word. It offers a safe space to unapologetically express and share one's interest in poetry, fiction, non-fiction, drama, story writing, and various other forms of written pieces. It brings people with different interests and similar interests together and enables healthy discussions on various topics such as literary tropes, genres, characters, plots, literary devices, etc.

The comparison between fiction and nonfiction enlightened the class about what different people look for when they pick a book to read. Some read for knowledge, some read for mental pleasure and peace, and the rest read for a combination of the both. When all these students are placed in a single room it gives birth to a multitude of approaches regarding the same topic. It is this very diversity that turns every club session into a beautiful learning experience. No matter how much you read you will always have something new to learn everyday.

Extreme makeover, reverse extreme makeover, character study, “A book, A minute” allowed the students to completely immerse themselves in fictional universes and analyze the minute details in different plots. It helps them to imagine how the characters might respond when placed in a new fictional universe. Character arcs and character growth form a very important aspect of the discussion.

The different forms of poetry presented the students with insights into how poetry worked back in the day. They were left to wonder, “What makes a poem . . . a poem?”.

Activities such as prompt-based story writing and blackout poetry aided the students in unveiling their inner writer and let their imagination go wild.

For all the offline sessions of the music club, the main activities entailed everyone introducing themselves to the rest of the club and performing a short song for everyone.

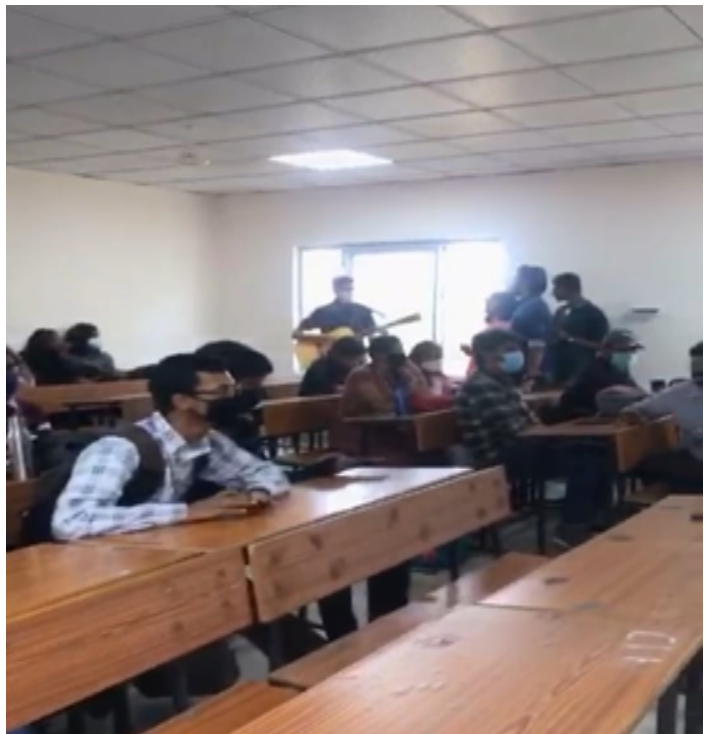
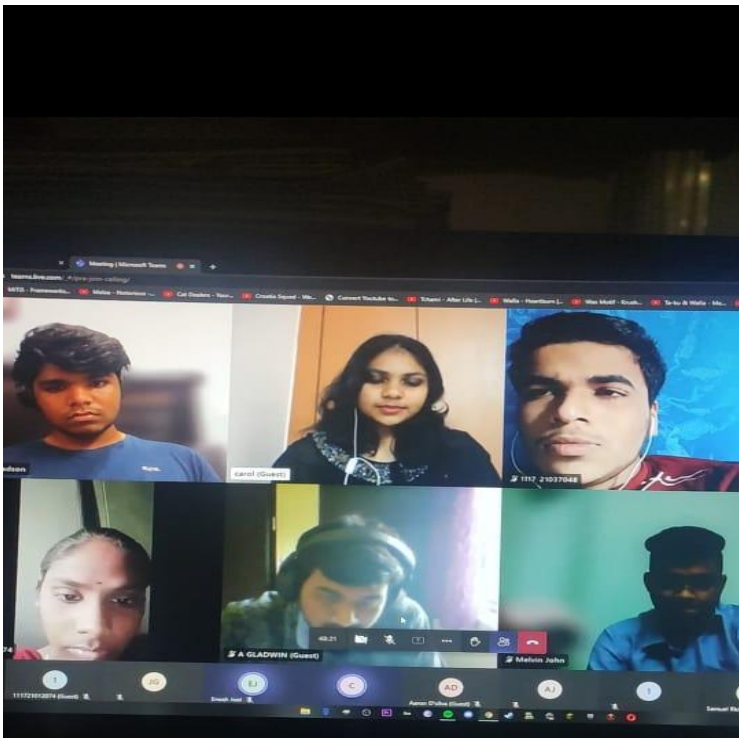
Secondly, the rest of the offline sessions were dedicated towards trying to find talented people who have good chemistry with each other so that a band could be formed.

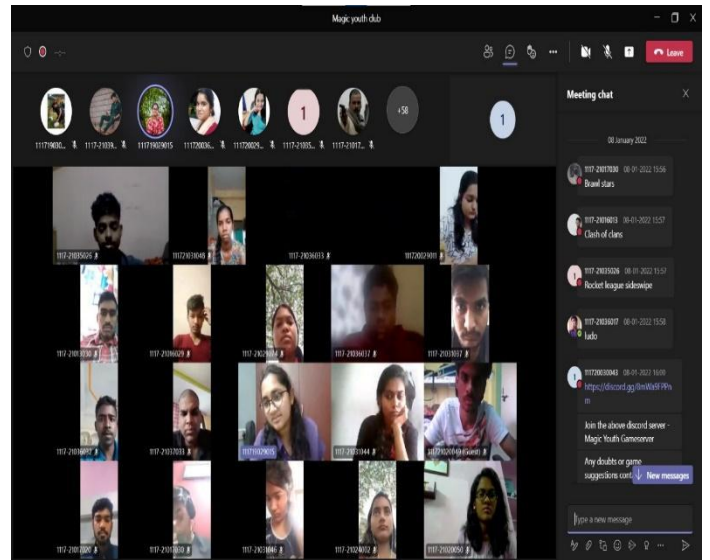
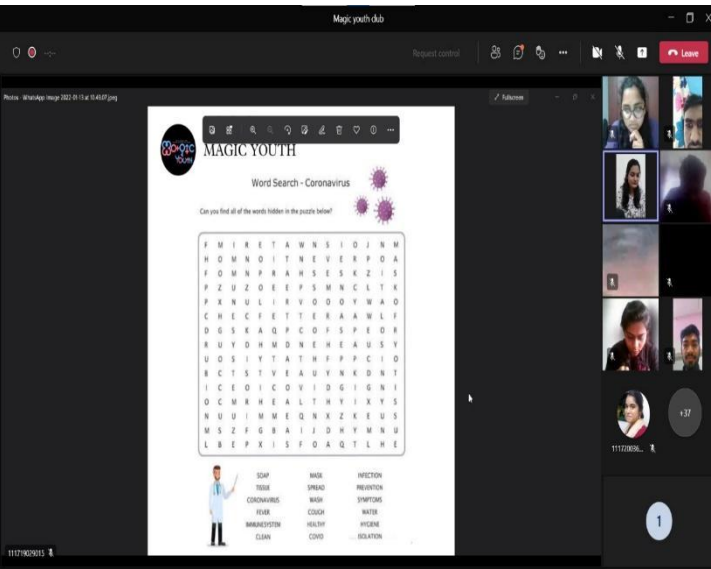
men and women of **conscience, competence, compassion and commitment** and be the agents of change for themselves and the community they live in.

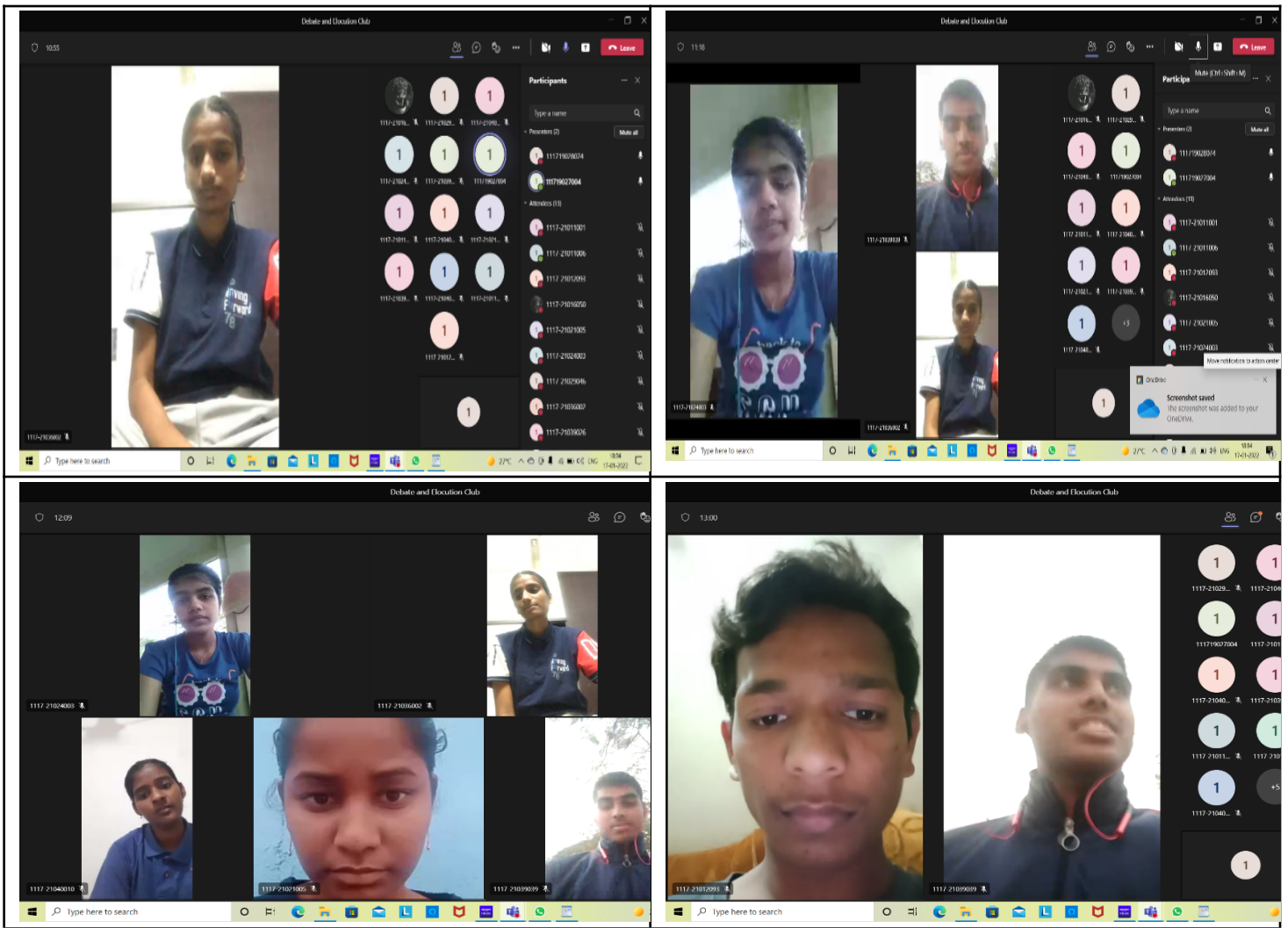
REPORT OF DEBATE AND ELOCUTION CLUB

In the third club session, “Dumb Charades” was played to test the knowledge of the club members with regards to the Entertainment Industry.



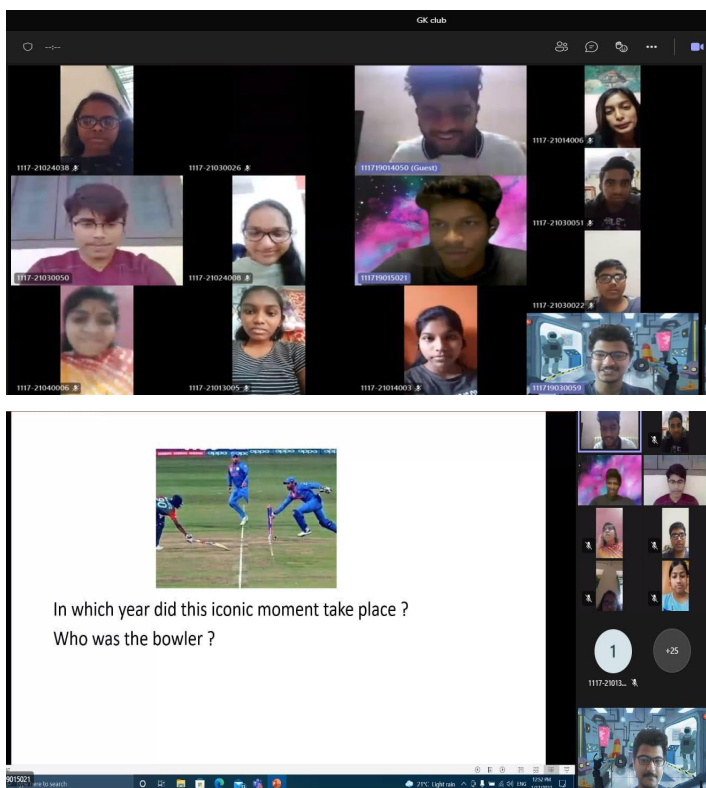

The photography and film club helps the students to explore the digital world of cinema and the art of photography.

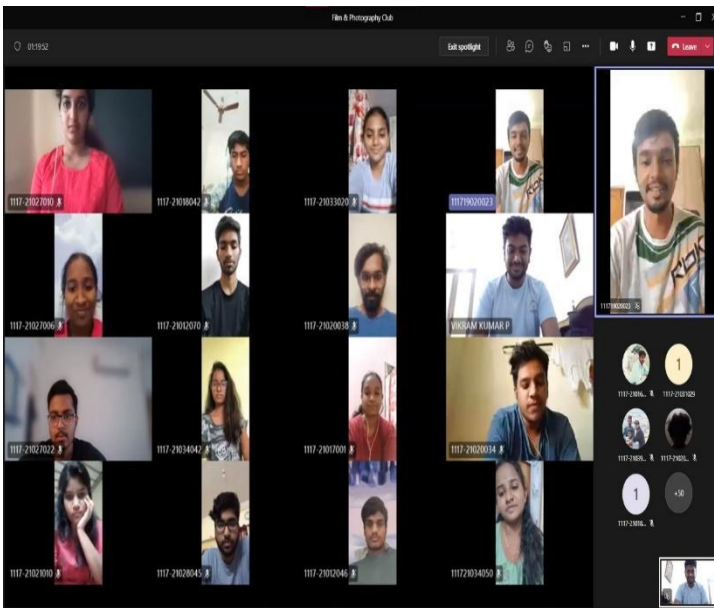

REPORT OF FINANCE CLUB

Day 1 (Offline)

Date: 5th January 2022

Time: 1 p.m.-4p.m. (3 hours)



The first day of finance club was filled with enthusiasts who wanted to learn about different aspects of finance. Before starting with any activity, all the club members along with the Club Coordinators discussed the **concept of**

finance. Each one of them had different answers to it which was combined to form a meaning. The club members were then asked about the various interests they hold in this club and what are their expectations out of this club. The inputs were collected to be used to conduct activities in future sessions.

To test each members' ability, a **word game** was organized as a part of this session. The word game involved dividing the students into various groups of seven and asking them to give words based on their knowledge. The next team would use the last letter of the word given by the previous team to provide another word. This was a point based game given on the basis of difficulty level of financial vocabulary. Various words came up such as Xenocurrency, yield curve, hedging, treasury issue packed securities, Ethereum, market capital etc.

Day 2 (Offline)

Date: 6th January 2022

Time: 1 p.m.-4p.m. (3 hours)

This session was focused on the topic 'Strategic management'. The students were asked about their definition of strategy and the various answers were merged to come to our own club definition of strategy. Various aspects of strategic management were discussed along with organizing few activities like case studies, questionnaire.

The next discussion was on reading various books on finance. Books like Rich Dad Poor Dad, Think and Grow Rich, Investing 101, The Richest Man of Babylon, The Millionaire Next Door were few books suggested and discussed.

Day 3 (Offline)

Date: 7th January 2022

Time: 1 p.m.-4p.m. (3 hours)

This session was an interactive one where two students- **Adarsh Chetty (111721037021)** and **Amit Sidhanti (111721037024)** from B.com Business Analytics took the initiative of talking about the stock markets and share their experience as stock traders. They also showcased their **stock portfolio** discussing various companies that are profitable and worth **investing**. They shared their tactics of investing and presented the do's and don'ts. All the other students has different questions which were answered by them such as various **other investing options** like mutual funds, chit funds etc, and also **calculation of interest**.

Day 4 (Online)

Date: 8th January 2022

Time: 3:30 p.m.-5:30p.m. (2 hours)

In light of the situation and the government declaring a shut down for all the educational institutions, the college unfortunately had to stop its operations. However, the clubs resumed its activities as scheduled on the online platform. This session was based on the concept of **budgeting**. Before starting with the session, **current affairs** were discussed in the field of finance. Each one of them was then asked the meaning of the word 'budget' and its importance. Various answers were collected to form one single definition. Various types of budgets were discussed along with the 50-30-20 rule. Later, a case study was given to all the students to create their own budget on the scenario.

Day 5 (Online)

Date: 10th January 2022

Time: 3:30 p.m.-5:30p.m. (2 hours)

Based on students' recommendations and feedback on their expectations from the club, this session was conducted where in a student **Moses Salandri** (111721014043) from B.com Honors gave his **presentation** on the topic '**Asset Management**'. Various questions and doubts were asked by all the students in regards to the topic. This session was then elevated with talking about various **careers prospects** in the field of finance along with other opportunities.

Day 6 (Online)

Date: 11th January 2022

Time: 3:30 p.m.-5:30p.m. (2 hours)

This session for the club was very special as a guest lecture was organized for the students because of their heavy interest in **stock markets and investing**. **Poorna Chandra Reddy** who is a finance enthusiast was invited as a guest lecturer to give his insights on stock market trading. Poorna did his Bachelor of Business Administration from Loyola Academy Degree and PG College. Currently he's working on his start-up companies Market Direction and Healthy Shots which is in the focused on the areas of Finance, Health and Fitness and Education.

Day 7 (Online)

The session begin with the club coordinators giving a brief introduction about what is going to happen in today's session. 11th Jan'22

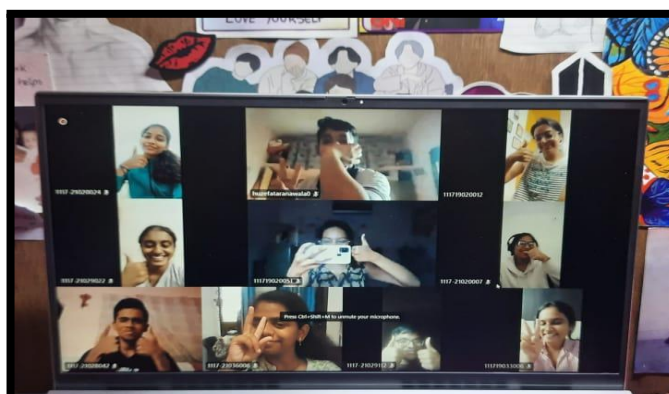

13th Jan'22

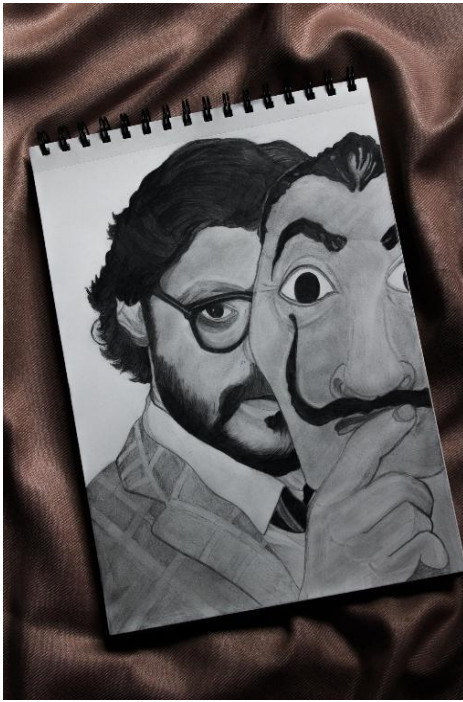

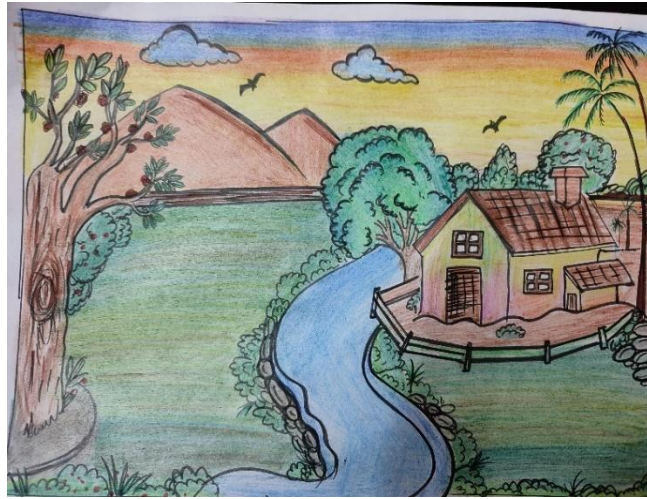
On day 2, we conducted an activity called *Miniature Art* It was introduced in 16th Century which is trailed till date. And here are some amazing miniature artworks by our students.

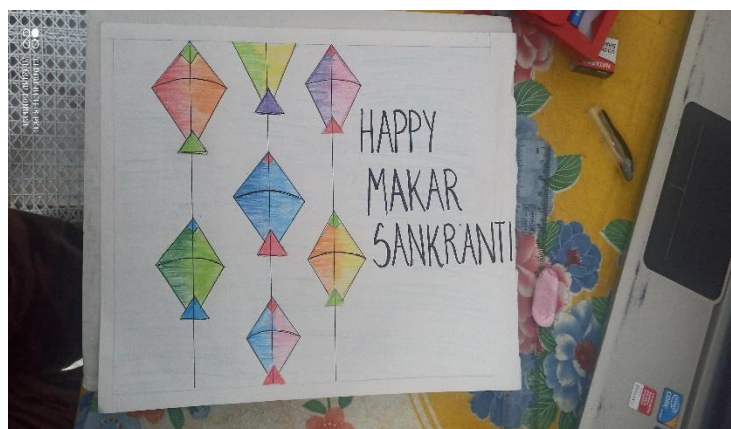

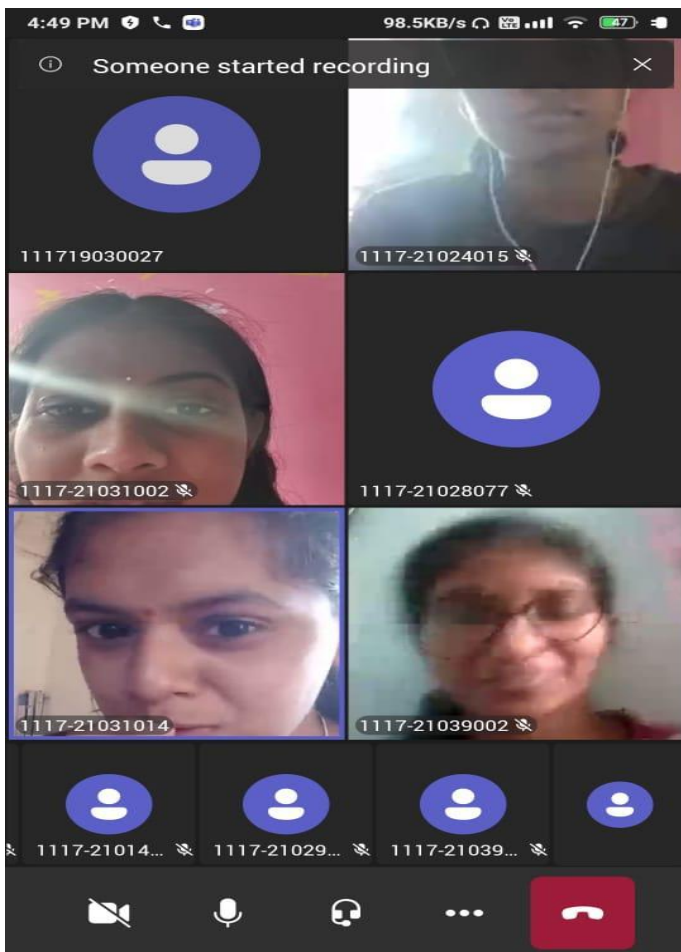
