1. Department: Food technology and management and Food science nutrition and dietetics.

Title: Webinar on “Emotional well-being of students during pandemic

Date: 8th June 2021

Number of Participants: 200

A webinar on "emotional wellbeing of students during pandemic” was organized for UG food technology and management and food science nutrition and dietetics students and faculty by Loyola academy, Hyderabad on 8th June 2021 at 10:50AM. The total number of participants for the webinar are around 200.

The webinar was started by addressing the speaker by the HOD of BSc. Food Technology and management department.

Dr. Samson Gandhi started the webinar by grabbing everybody's attention by giving a familiar example from a well-known Bollywood movie called "3 idiots" where the main lead imitates a Nepali Ghurkha (watchman) who says " nothing to worry, don't get disturbed, ALL IS WELL. I am watching over you, you sleep tight". Then he comes to the actual topic where he focussed on the importance of being healthy both mentally and physically, citing various examples from the everyday life. The webinar was aimed at fostering students to understand and practice emotional well-being and take note of their daily activities and how are they affecting their minds. 'Dr. Samson Gandhi' (Faculty, Person to Person Institute for Christian counselling) headlined the webinar and also explained the types of emotions which is positive emotions and negative emotions. Where he referred positive emotions as 'roses of fragrance' which includes love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness and self-control; and negative emotions as 'thorns in the flesh'.

The webinar started with an interactive session with students where students were allowed to identify the emotions seen on the slide shared my him. The motive of the webinar was to

make the students aware that they are not alone facing issues but all of them have some kind of stress and emotional breakdowns. Also, the fact that physical and mental health go hand in hand was also exemplified. The webinar mainly focused on the fact of conquering negative emotions like anxiety, fear, anger, guilt/shame, depression which he related with the current pandemic situation and also he said to accept the truth , face it and deal with it and be thankful for what we have and live in the present ; and he also talked about the connection between emotional and spiritual balance in life, which is followed by a questionnaire round where students and faculties queries were solved.

The students and faculty really enjoyed the webinar and also felt relieved sharing their day-to-day issues and feedbacks on the webinar. The faculty members appreciated his sweet words.

The webinar concluded with the students being provided forms to fill, in order to be a part of this webinar.

Mr B A Abhishek, who is a man of expertise in the field of photography with an experience of over 9 years, conducted 2 hours workshop with the students of mass communication through an online platform known as MS teams.

He started with sharing knowledge about the company he is working with, as an assistant manager, that is Fujifilm India and explained us why they are the most trusted brand since 85 years and sell top industrial cameras worldwide, he specified the 3 main element of their cameras that makes them the best (image quality, colour reproduction and lenses).

He then moved on to explain the camera concept and explained to us the working of pinhole cameras.

He then explained to us the concept of DSLR cameras and mirrorless cameras and also emphasized on which one is better and why. And well in detail shared with us his knowledge on the main aspects of shutter speed, ISO, white balance, aperture etc .He then shared with us the different types of compositions and specifically mentioned the golden eye and framing being his favourite among all the others.

Title: Webinar on WHITE NOISE

Date: 14th August' 2021

Report on White Noise

The department of Psychology, English and Journalism organized a symposium, titled, White Noise: A Symposium on Subtle Sexism on 14th August, 2021. The session began with an inaugural address by the Dean of Arts, Dr. G. Ratna Vani and the HOD Ms. D. Elsitia, highlighting the objectives and the need to address issues with respect to gender in varied spaces of our everyday life. The first half of the session comprised of two guest lectures. The first guest lecture for the day was delivered by Dr. Lalitha Sarma, assistant professor at DB Pampa College, Kerala. Her talk was titled 'My Imperfect Feminisms: Theory and Praxis'. Dr. Lalitha Sarma highlighted how one could find subtle sexism in everyday life. One highlight of the talk was as to how keyboard keys were designed in a manner to suit the fingers of the sex 'male'. This was further extended to sexism in travel spaces such as trains, wherein the place to keep excess baggage was again structured in a way to suit the average height of the sex 'male'. The second lecture was by Dr. Kavya Krishna K.R, assistant professor, IIT BHU. Her talk was titled, 'Gender and Politics of Experience in The Great Indian Kitchen'. Dr. Kavya Krishna spoke about gender politics in the movie, The Great Indian Kitchen, also highlighting on the separate space for women, that is 'the kitchen'. The most neglected space in any Indian household and the stereotypes existing with menstruation, traditional method of cooking, gender roles; in a nut shell it focussed on the drudgery in the lives of Indian women, who spend a significant amount of their lives in the kitchen. She also brought in varied symbolisms, one being the broken sink pipe, which indicates the broken relationship between the lady and the husband Further it asserts on the need for individuality


of a women , beyond these cloistered spaces , here being, the kitchen. The afternoon session comprised of paper presentations by students across varied disciplines on the topic of casual sexism in everyday life. Students highlighted varied arenas wherein they could spot casual sexism on a daily basis. Their ideas were supported via a PPT presentation. Three best presentations were selected by Dr. Lalitha Sarma, evaluating them on basis of their content, uniqueness of their presentation and delivery skills. Overall, the two lectures sensitized and created awareness on the aspect of general discrimination in not just major spaces but also in the insignificant spaces of our everyday life, which helped the students to foster a more humane relationship with other sexes and to bear in mind the ways one sex could conveniently assert dominance over the other, because of the patriarchal undertones in the contemporary society.

On the day of fest:

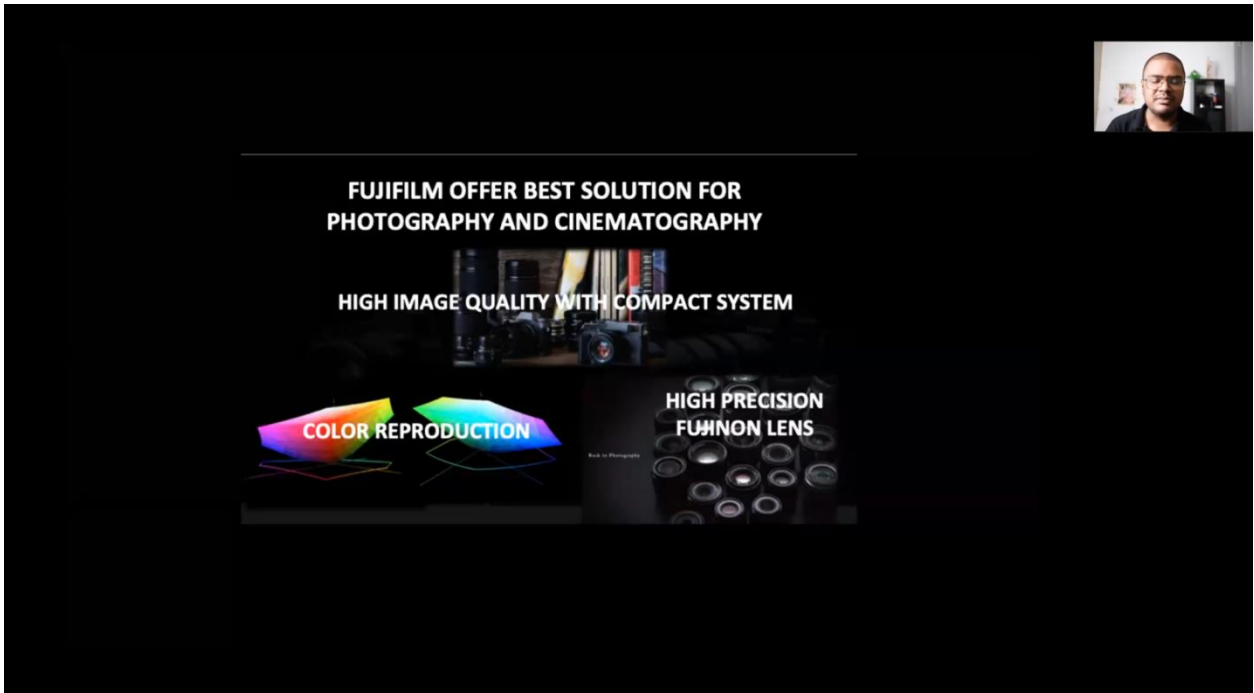

Topic : “EXPLORING NEW CAREER CHOICES IN THE CORPORATE LANDSCAPE”

“Career choice is one of the important decisions in life that will define an individual’s status in the society” On 25th September 2021, a guest lecture was organized by Dr. T. Rachel Shalini Ma’am for the MBA students which focused on Human Resource Talent Acquisition to enable the students to have a well-thought-out decision to set professional goals for designing a career path for their future. The guest speaker for the seminar was Mr. Joel Raj Sorna who is a Sr. IT Talent Acquisition Expert and also an alumnus of Loyola Academy. Mr. Joel started the seminar by discussing efficient ways to plan a job career and to better explain this, he conducted a psychometric test on two students, the results of which were announced in the end of the seminar. He further continued to discuss the different career paths in MBA that the students can explore and fetch jobs from. He gave an in-depth explanation about the recruitment process and shed light on the different interview rounds that most companies follow and asserted that the students be active on job portals such as LinkedIn and Naukari.com. He insisted the students upon taking up coaching to crack the aptitude tests during interviews and to appear for regular interviews to gain a better insight into the interview process and to keep track of the current affairs of the various organizations. The queries of the students were clarified by Mr. Joel to their fullest content after the seminar was completed. The seminar was overall a productive and informative session.



3. Industry Academia Interface

Topic : Advanced certificate course in "Financial Analysis and Modelling"

This course was initiated on 20th August 2021, which was organized by Fr. Dr L Joji Reddy SJ (Principal of Loyola Academy), Dr. Sindhu Varghese (HOD of MBA, Loyola Academy), Mr. T. Hanook and Mrs. Sheeba Jackson (Course Co-ordinators, Loyola Academy) for MBA students to understand the application and analysis of financial data and its interpretation in the real-world scenario. The resource person for the advanced certificate course was Rev Fr Dr S. Raja Ratna Reddy. (B.Tech, FPM/ Ph.D From XLRI, Professor of Finance SFIMAR Mumbai).

This was a 20-hour program conducted twice a week on every Tuesday and Friday. It's a kind of bridge course between Financial Analysis and Modelling and Financial Management. This course had begun with the introduction of Vertical and Horizontal analysis of the income statement and covered financial statements, Ratio Analysis, Relative valuation, Comparable company analysis, Calculation of Weighted Average cost of capital, discounted cash flows techniques. Namely: NPV, IRR methods, Functions used in financial models along with the problem-solving part. This course mainly helped and taught the students to work with financial functions on MS excels.

Overall, this course helped the students to understand and learn the terms and functions of financial analysis and modelling and this certificate course was very

much beneficial for the students which enhanced their skill in operating financial functions on MS excel that is technical knowledge of operating financial applications in real time scenario was inflated.



7. Department: IQAC & Research Committee

Title: International FDP on Innovative research techniques

This Faculty Development Program on “Innovative Research Techniques” aims to inculcate and enhance the abilities of the faculty members to carry out independent research, to write successful research projects, and finally to enable them for research oriented technical communication. Lectures were given by the experts on fundamental aspects of

- Research topic selection,
- Literature review,
- Planning of research,
- Project proposal writing and
- Research paper writing.

Apart from that hands-on practice also enabled participants to grasp the content methodologically. While designing the structure of the programme it was kept in mind to cater to that faculty from different background.

Objective: To enlighten the students about current market opportunities.

The presentation by Ms. Tinanda and Ms. Khushi from NBA on the buzzing topic, Metaverse and how it is changing the face of doing business.

The presentation was titled "Metaverse". They covered the following topics in detail:

- What is Metaverse?
- History of Metaverse
- Latest Developments in Metaverse
- Metaverse – Changing the face of doing business
- Advantages of Metaverse
- Risks involved in using Metaverse
- Future of Metaverse

2.1. Metaverse and its history

The word "meta" is a prefix of Greek-origin meaning "beyond" while "verse" comes from the word "universe". Metaverse is a digital world created using different technologies like Virtual Reality (VR), Augmented Reality (AR), cryptocurrency, and the Internet. It is a virtual world where one can live a synchronous life through their avatar.

The history of metaverse dates way back, even when the internet was new, the word "Metaverse" was coined by a science fiction writer in 1992 in his book titled Snow Crash where he described a 3D virtual space named Metaverse where everyone can have their own avatars. As years passed by, the gaming industry became the flagbearer of Metaverse especially with the rise of Roblox, Fortnite and Axie Infinity who built their own virtual universe along with their own virtual currency. The major highlight of 2021 being 'Facebook' changing its name to 'Meta Inc.' and the announcements of its multiple projects for being the frontrunner in building metaverse.

2.2. Latest Developments in Metaverse

The following are the latest developments in metaverse:

a. South Korean government to make Seoul a metaverse city by Dec 2022. The Seoul mayor said that this is a part of the 10-year plan for the city, and has set a \$3.3 million investment for the metaverse.

b. Data vault holdings on 14th January announced that it has developed a metaverse art gallery in collaboration with the inaugural international art event World Art Forum, hosted by the National Museum of Egyptian Civilization.

c. eToro, the popular social trading and investment platform, announced the launch of its metaverse-themed smart portfolio dubbed MetaverseLife, aimed at offering investors long-term exposures to stocks, crypto-assets, and key projects within the metaverse industry.

d. According to Strategic analytics - The global Metaverse market is forecast to hit nearly \$42 billion globally by 2026.

2.3. Metaverse: Changing the face of doing business

i) Hyundai and Unity Partnership on making Meta-Factory

Hyundai Motor Company and Unity announced a partnership to design and build a new metaverse roadmap and platform for Meta-Factory. The partnership will make Hyundai, the first auto company to build a Meta-Factory, a digital-twin of an actual factory, supported by a metaverse platform. The MOU focuses on smart manufacturing, AI training & study, and autonomous driving simulation. Consumers will be able to trial, test and engage various auto-related solutions digitally before choosing physical vehicles.

ii) Walmart believed to launch its own cryptocurrency

According to a CNBC report on January 17th, Walmart is believed to have filed seven applications relating to the crypto-ecosystem and metaverse technology with the US Patents and Trademarks Office.

iii) Ready to move into its permanent crypto art salesroom, the auction house unveiled Sotheby's Metaverse

In 2021 International auction house Sotheby's opened a replica of its iconic London galleries in Decentraland to court crypto art collectors and held an NFT art show.

iv) Nike filed multiple trademark applications

Nike, which filed multiple trademark applications, less than a week after Meta's unveiling already bought virtual sneaker and collectable creator RTFKT (pronounced as 'Artifact') Studios to sell sneakers and apparel in the metaverse. Nike also announced a partnership with the metaverse giant Roblox to create an online world called Nikeland. Nikeland is a free space platform to explore games where players will be able to try out new sports shoes and run marathons.

From the above-mentioned happenings, it is inferred that Metaverse is not only impacting a single sector but each and every sector and hence it is changing the face of doing business, keeping in mind, the possibilities are endless in future to what changes may occur.

2.4. Advantages and Risks Involved in Metaverse

Meta can be advantageous in sundry facets or aspects such as socializing, shopping, buying of lands, buildings also customized avatars using cryptocurrency.

Though metaverse unleashes opportunities, it has the same old typical cybersecurity Risks. It is still unpredictable in a nascent stage.

It also holds a vigorous power to manipulate the way people play, shop, interact virtually either in a good way or otherwise.

2.5. Future of Metaverse

Metaverse came into limelight after Facebook changed its name to Meta Inc. Which portrays strategy converting, sci-fi vision interoperability. Many metaverses are going to be there which will compete in transforming our social media experience, electronic commerce expericxe, and online ways of collaborations and transactions.

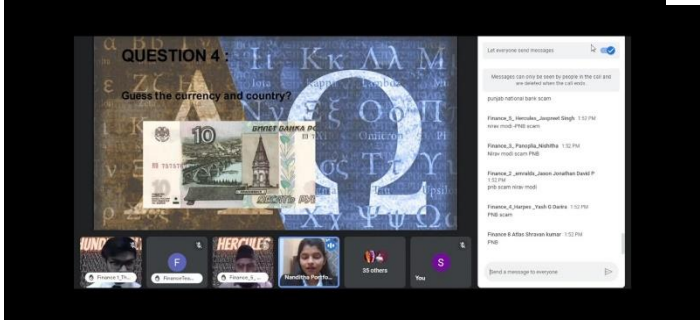
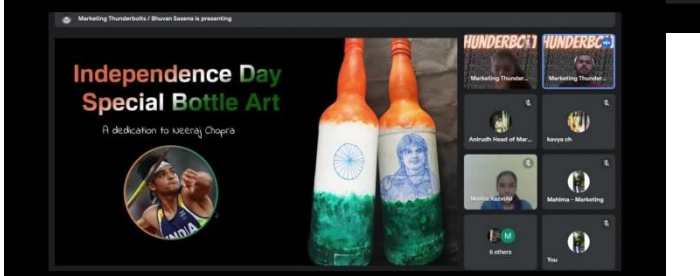


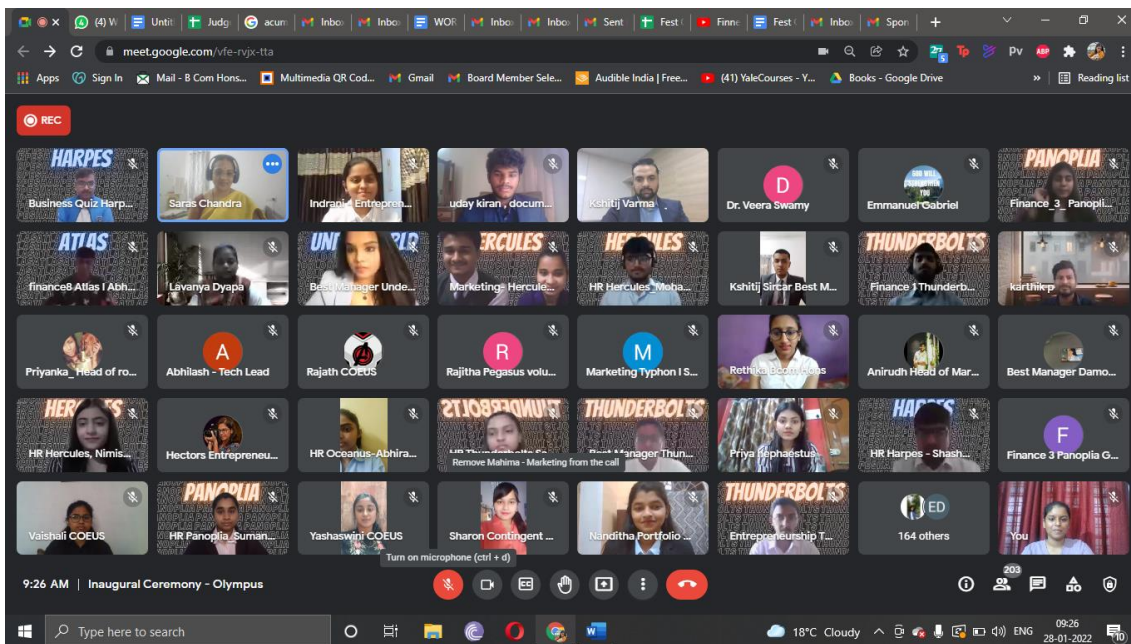

The participants are required to analyse, interpret, devise and detect the best out of the two with the help of the financial data that is available in the case study.

They are required to present their decision with logical, financial reasons with proper working notes and have to convince the judges to believe so. (A PPT is used for the presentation).

Their spontaneity and command on the subject will be put to the test by the judges, by asking the participants a couple of questions relating to the case study.

Filler 1 : pieci eikonas This round was “ guess the picture round” Participants were shown pictures of various categories (currency , banks , scams) and within a stipulated time, participants had to answer through a chat box.

This was a fun and refreshing round.

Round 3: finance quiz

This round was divided into 3 sub round

3.1 picturesque

3.2 crosswords

3.3 rapid fire

Different teams were taken into different breakout rooms to conduct each round.

Picturesque: two pictures were displayed and participants had to guess the term (one word) by taking relevant hints from the pictures.

Crosswords: 6 sets were prepared for this round and each team was given a different set.

Participants had to solve the puzzle with the stipulated time.

Rapid fire: finance related questions were asked and participants had to answer within the stipulated time.

Filler 2 : guess the term

Timings : 4:15- 4:35

This round was enthusiastic and interactive. Participants had to guess the jumbled words within the given time.

Overnight task for the taxation round began at 7pm

FINANCE PORTFOLIO

DAY 2

Day 2 of the fest began with round 4 : Tax verse under finance portfolio.

This round consists of 3 levels.

Under level 1 of round 4 started at 7.00 pm on 28th January. In this round the contestants were asked to consider themselves as a tax agent. They have to prepare a video which should specify the details of financial services provided by them to educate the public about their tax agency. This round is conducted with an aim to help participants sell/market their financial knowledge. The participants made a 3 minutes video of their presentation and were judged on the basis of their financial knowledge, name of the tax agency , catchy headings , storyline etc.

Day 2 of the fest began with the review of the overnight task given to the participants under level 2.

Level 2 : Poll tax blues was the next level under round 4. In this round the participants were given a tax-based question which they had to solve within 3 hours of time. The questions were given to the participants on 28th January at 11.00 pm. The participants made a ppt presentation and calculated the total income and tax liability of the given case. The ppt was submitted by the participants within 3 hours.

The PPT made by each team was presented to the judges Dr. Sireesha ma'am, Dr. Alekya ma'am and Karthikeya sir (HOD OF BCOM HONS) on 29th January. The presentation round started at 9.30 am and each team was given 3 minutes to explain their case and it was reviewed by the judges on the basis of accuracy of the solution , presentation skills and communication skills.

After the end of each teams presentation the Level 3 : The silvered tongue was conducted. In this round the participants were given an investment option like gold , nft, fixed deposits etc . And they were asked to choose the best investment option stating it as an efficient investment option. The participants were given 2 minutes to state their case and the judges cross questioned them regarding their choices and risks associated with it. This round was conducted after the presentation of each team right after level 2. The participants were judged on the basis of their negotiation skills, communication skills and their ability to answer the questions posed to them.

With this , round 4 Tax verse under Finance portfolio ended at 11.45 am on 29th .

To make the participants feel relaxed in such a stressful and competitive environment, filler round was conducted.

The filler round which is basically a fun round to engage the participants began at 11:50 am . Anchor – Sudarshan .In this filler round the participants were to guess the price of each product shown to them . The participants were really enthusiastic and gave many responses throughout the round. They were able to guess the prices correctly in an instant. It was really overwhelming to see such great response from the participants. The filler round lasted for about 15 minutes.

With the end of the filler round the next round, which is round 5 ; IPL BIDDING, started at at 12. 10 pm.

For round 5 , the 9 teams were split into two breakout room, 5 teams in one room and other 4 teams in another room . The round 5 was lead by Avinash , Sudarshan, Sam.

This was an auction round. In this round each team was given a name like MI , SRH , PBKS etc.. and were asked to buy 5 cricket players with a total amount of 50,00,000. Each team was supposed to bid on the cricket player within the total amount. Each cricket player was given a credit point. The team which has the high credit points wins.

During this round the teams fiercely competed against each other to buy the cricket player. They really bid on the player for a whopping amount. This auction lasted for two hours and ended at 2.00 pm . With this, the rounds under finance portfolio came to an end.

The participants were given a break of half an hour.

Then at 2.30 pm the padlet session began. Anchors – Nanditha and Sravani. During this session the participants were asked to express their views and opinions regarding the fest, how was their experience in a management fest. The participants gave their overwhelming responses through the padlet link given to them.

HR PORTFOLIO

The HR Portfolio consisted of five Rounds headed by each team member.

Round 1 was **HIRE AND FIRE** and Round lead was Burhan, under this round, a case study was given to the participants, in which a particular historical event and its effect on the corporate world were elaborated. The participants were required to come with recruitment, retainment and layoff strategies that efficiently turns the crisis to their leverage or simply put, the participants playing HR manager of a particular company needed to thoroughly analyze the crisis at hand and carry out their functions (hire, retain and fire employees) meticulously such that it battles the impasse emerged. This round was scheduled for 2 hrs from 10:00am-11:50 from which the participants had to give task 1 deliverables at 10:40 sharp and then had to give their presentation at 11:00am to the judges. The judges of this round were Mrs Usha Vaidehi and Dr. Hima Bind. Round 1 was successfully accomplished by all the participants.

Round 2 was **NO BAIL** and the round lead was Deepak. This round was scheduled between 12:00pm – 1:40pm, in this round, a case study was presented to each participant team wherein the task at hand was to retain the employees in the organization. The case studies which were presented brought up different situations wherein the employees would prefer to leave the company and the participants play the role of an HR manager in the company and need to devise a strategy to retain employees in the company. Also, in this round the teams were not allowed to use word document or powerpoint presentation instead they had to make posters, videos, gif etc. for presentation. The judges of the round were Mrs. Kamla (Assistant Hr executive at Ktree Computer Solutions India pvt ltd) and Ms. Sherly (Hr Associate at coMAKEIT software pvt ltd). The basis of judgment was strategy formulating skills, creative skills and presentation skills.

Completion with Round 2 successfully the participants were given LUNCH BREAK for 45 min after which two Interim was conducted, the first interim round was **CODE DE CODE** in which participants were given 20 questions and time allotted for each question were 20 seconds only. The 2nd Interim round was **SCRABBLE WORD GAME**, in these 10 questions were displayed to participants and each question was displayed only for 15 second.

The participants enjoyed the interim round, with this participant had successfully entered **Round 3** and the last round for the day which was **TAKE DE BATE** lead by Sanjana Verma. Under this round, the participants were given situations that usually appear in the HR world that evoke opinions that are contradictory. Each of two teams are presented with same situation, each team is asked to advocate a view contradictory to the other team and a debate is conducted between the two. The judges for this round were Mrs Krupali and Mr Riam, the

round was well conducted by the round head and had a very good response from the participants.

The day 1 was now over but the management wanted the participants to burn the midnight oil too, so with this each portfolio had to give a midnight task for the participants. Athena portfolio decided to assign the midnight task as case studies to the participants and the deadline for the task were 1:30am sharp. The participants took this a challenge and when checked upon the deliverables, each team was better than one another. With this we get to know each team was fighting best to stay on the top in the race.

DAY 2

Day 2 started with one of the most interesting rounds which was **ECCLESIA** led by Essica Theodonna. This round was much similar to an MUN, under which a trending topic is discussed while each team is allotted a company and the latter acts as a representative of the same. They had to put forward their views and plausible solutions to the emerging unflattering circumstance while they also battled questions regarding their company. The topic for this round was Human vs AI, Mr Tom and Mr Naresh took the initiative to judge this round and kept the basis of judgment as research skills and presentation skills. The round took much more time to complete than the allotted time. With the end of the 4th round the participants were given a lunch break and then continued with the next round.

The last round was **RUSH HOUR** headed by the round lead Albin Raju, the judges for this round was Mr Prashant. This round was to test participants' ability to commence all of the recruitment protocol as HR team members of a particular company. Each team was given a job role to write an enticing job description about as task 1. As task 2 various candidates were presented to each team as interviewees and the participants were supposed to interview the candidates and task 3 is to draft an offer letter to the selected candidates. The round was smoothly conducted and participants enjoyed the round.

Now we had the 3rd and the last interim round that was **GUESSTIMATE**, in which famous celebrity or morphed pictures were presented on the screen for 10 seconds and they had to answer within the time allotted only. It was an interesting and fun round and every participant was happy with the successful completion of day 2. 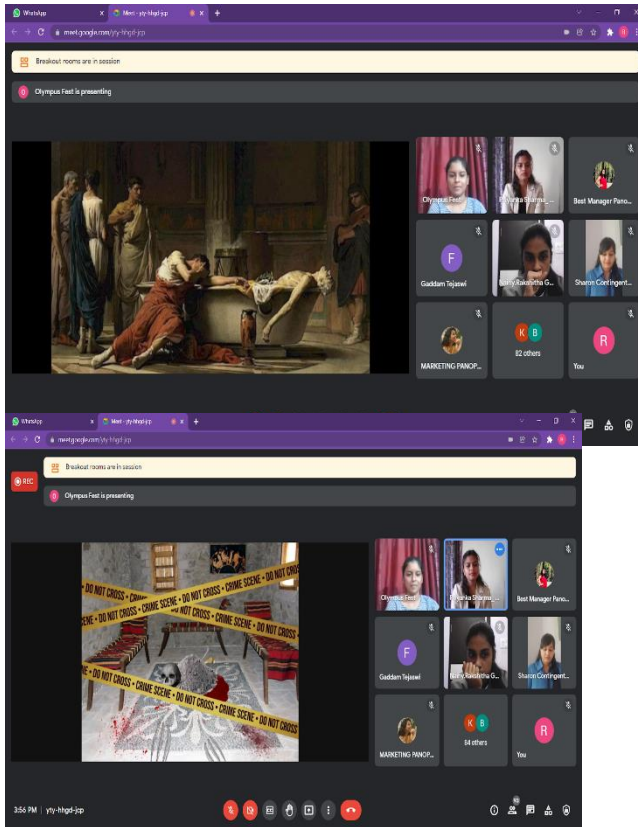
Murder mystery event.

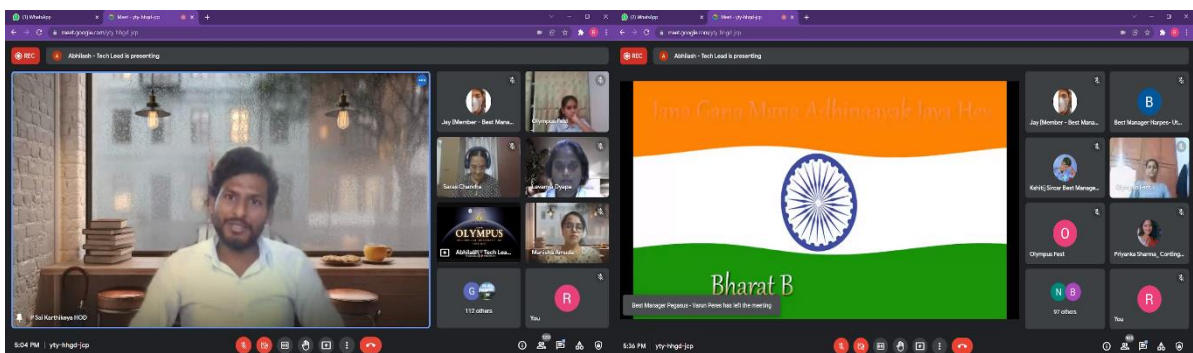




Valedictory ceremony

To focus on these ideas, the faculty of mathematics, Statistics and Computer science departments of both UG and PG have decided to organize an international conference to promote research and collaboration in emerging areas, encourage continued work on important problems that help to maintain the pipeline of qualified researchers for the future.

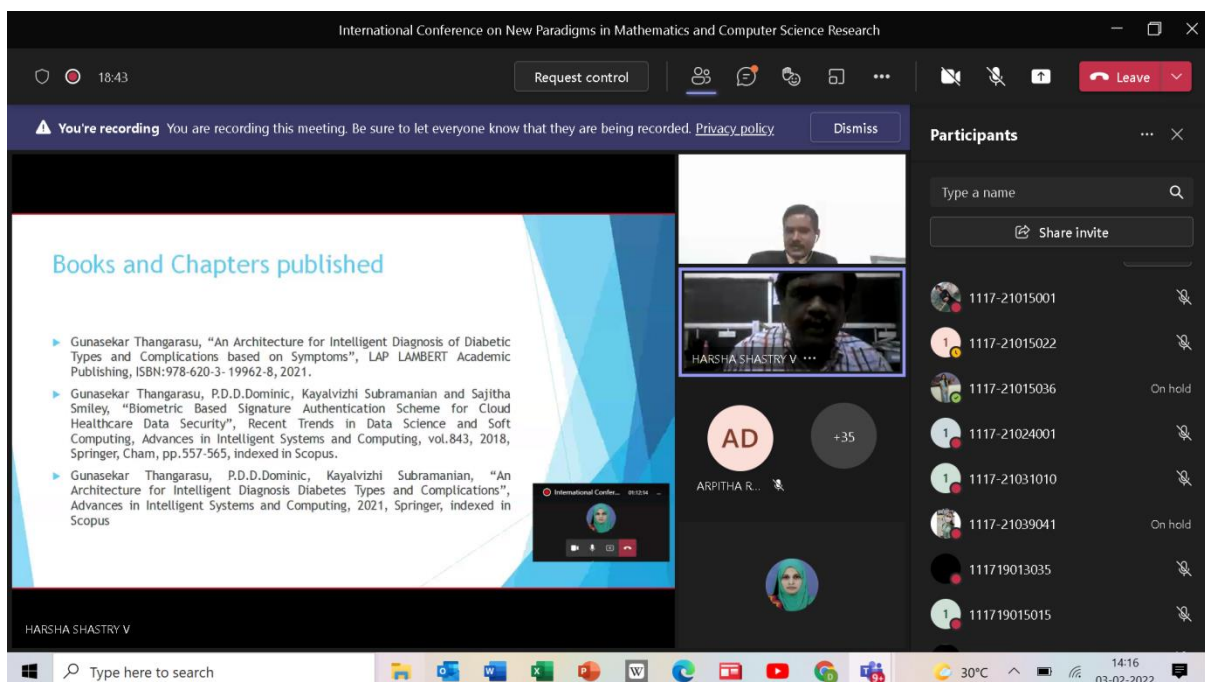
A Total of 4 Papers were presented in the paper presentation Session.



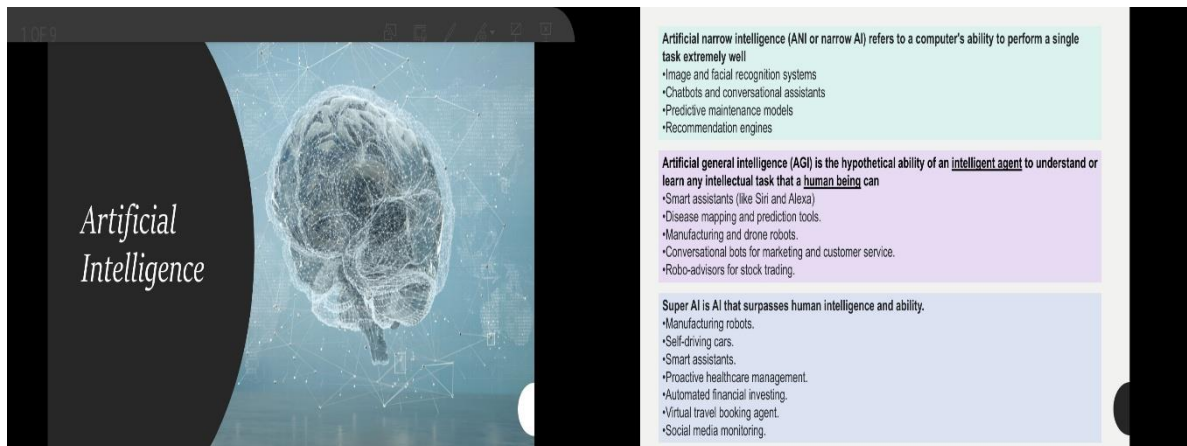

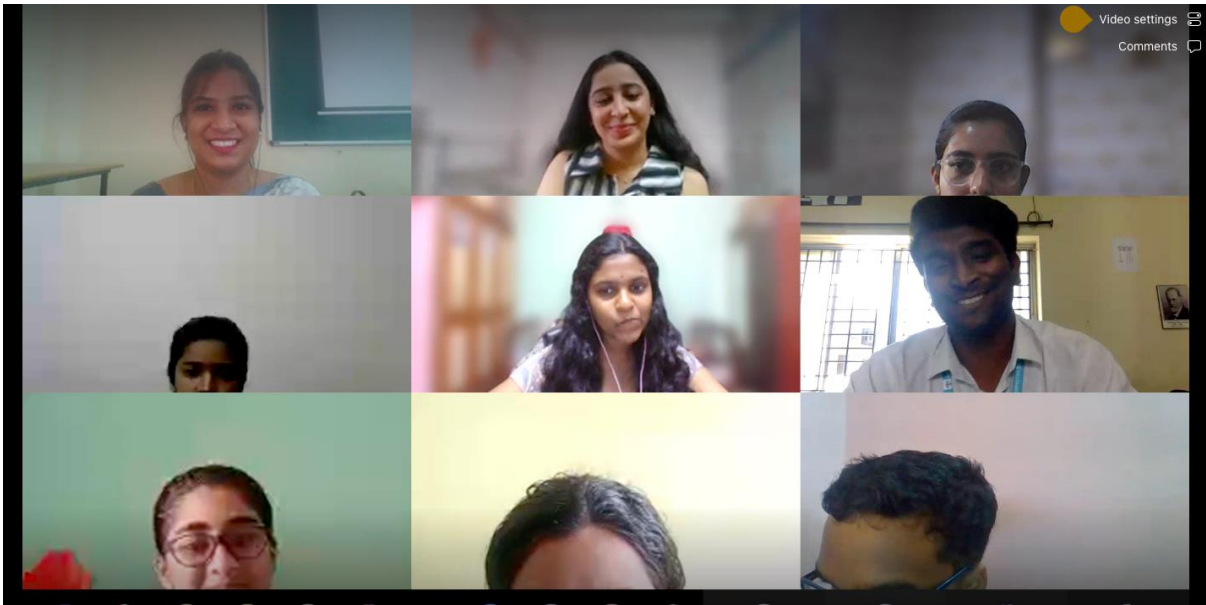
and cons of the profession, giving students an insight into what the role of a corporate counsellor involves.

. Session began at 3 PM by assistant professor, Department of Strategic Finance Ms. Anita Mathew who gave a brief about the Valedictory Ceremony.

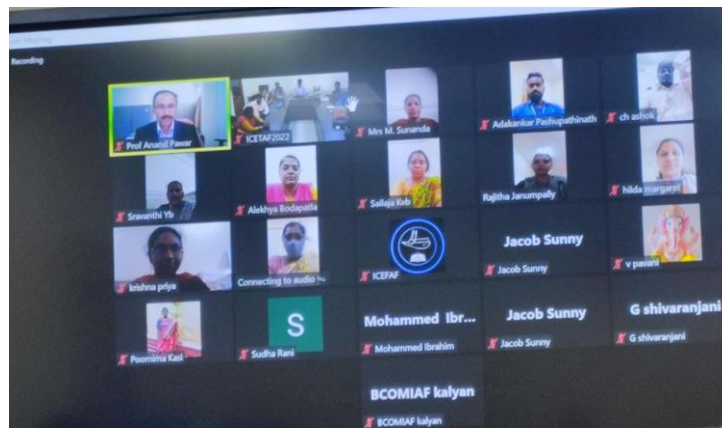

Report on Touchstone

(Worksop cum Symposium)

The department of Psychology, English and Journalism organized a two day symposium cum workshop on the 26-27th of April 2022, titled 'Touchstone- A two day Symposium cum Workshop'. The first day focussed on events catering to the major of Psychology and Journalism and the second day comprised of events catering to the field of literature.

On the first day we had two speakers; the first speaker Mr. Kadari Devraj, research scholar OU, who is currently pursuing his PhD in educational psychology from Osmania University and the second speaker was Ms. Coreena Soares, an independent journalist, the editor of Newsmeter, India's first satellite journalism site.
