#### **Name of The Event: FDP on Good Documentation Practices**

#### **Date: 5<sup>th</sup> June to 9<sup>th</sup> June 2023**

IQAC of Loyola Academy Degree and PG College organized a five day Faculty Development program on “Good Documentation Practice for Autonomous Colleges” for the Academic year 2023-24, from the 5<sup>th</sup> June to 9<sup>th</sup> June, 2023, from 9.40 am to 1.30 pm in the Xavier Hall.

#### **Objective:**

To improve the various criterion framework of NAAC, good documentation and maintenance of qualitative and quantitative metrics of the institution.

#### **REPORT:**

The Resource Persons for the program were Dr. Joseph I. Injodey, Advisor Quality Assurance, Christ University, Bangalore, Former Executive Director and Principal Raja Giri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) & Raja Giri Business School, former mentor Asian School of Business Trivandrum, mentor to eminent universities and colleges in India, & Mr. NK. Nikhil, IQAC Coordinator.

The Program began with a prayer led by Fr. Prabhu, who helped us to dispel the darkness and to be aware of our purpose in the Institution and who we are called to become, with the help of the Higher Power, the Ultimate Guru, the Creator.

The Prayer was followed by the symbolic lighting of the lamp by Rev. Fr. Ch. Amara Rao SJ, Rector, Rev. Fr. Dr. Francis Xavier SJ, Correspondent, Rev Fr. Dr. L. Joji Reddy, Principal and President of Xavier Board of Higher Education, Dr. Joseph I. Injodey and Mr. Nikhil.

The Rector Rev. Fr. Amara Rao welcomed the gathering and focused on different types of Ignatian pedagogies and rules and regulations of the institution. Then the Correspondent Rev. Fr. Dr. Francis Xavier blessed the occasion.

The Principal Rev. Fr. Dr. L Joji Reddy highlighted the role of a teacher, Acharya and Guru in the life of a Student and introduced the theme for the Faculty Development Program: Good Documentation Practice for Autonomous Colleges- An Initiative of IQAC.

### **Session I**

Topic: NAAC Criteria I- Curricular Aspects

The speaker has given insights of all the qualitative and the quantitative metrics of Curricular Aspects.

### **Session II**

Topic: NAAC Criteria II-Teaching-learning & Evaluation

The speaker emphasized the proper documentation of different key indicators of Teaching – Learning –Evaluation methods and explained about the Outcome Based Education (OBE).

The speaker highlighted the way in which the autonomy with regards to Academic, Administrative and Financial matters could be improved. They suggested that each department should equally contribute and excel.

### **Day-2**

Continuation of Criteria II- Teaching, Learning and Evaluation.

### **Session III**

Topic: NAAC Criteria III – Research, Innovations and Extensions

The speaker explained the importance of seed money projects and their evaluation, Departmental Incubation Centers, Research facilities, publications and Consultancy.

They focused on various Extension activities organized by NCC, NSS and suggested to promote the Multidisciplinary research. He suggested to the management to encourage the faculty for consultancy programs and provisions should be developed for the incubations

Students should also be encouraged for the entrepreneurship and startups.

### **Day-3**

#### **Session IV**

Topic: NAAC Criteria IV - Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Both the speakers discussed the various NAAC criteria requirements that need to be prioritized and implementation of new ideas and flexibility in the learning resources available to the students.

Library books and journals need to be updated according to the needs of the students and staff.

Plagiarism tools and SPSS tools should be made available to the research faculty.

They suggested the COE to improvise the digitalization process and make it easily accessible to students. They were greatly impressed by the infrastructure and the greenery around the campus.

A discussion was held with the Coordinators and Q/A Session with the faculty.

### **Day-4**

#### **Session V**

Topic: NAAC Criteria V – Student Support & Progression

They proposed to encourage more students to participate in competitive exams like NET, SLET etc. for PG students and GMAT, TOEFL, CA foundation exams, etc. for UG students.

Suggestions were provided for student to encourage them to increase their participation in curricular activities within the state and national level. Need to increase placements with renowned companies with higher packages.

Improve the strategies to involve an increased number of alumni participation and sponsors to the institution.

Increase in the scholarship to more number of students who are in genuine need.

## **Session VI**

Topic: NAAC Criteria VI – Governance, Leadership and Management.

They proposed the management to minimize the lengthy procedures that are presently in practice to avail the resources and make it simple. Financial assistance has to be enhanced for staff research participation and publications.

### **Session VII**

Topic: NAAC Criteria VII: Institutional Values & Best Practices

They recommended the best practices of each department to be embraced as Institution's best practices.

### **Session VIII**

Topic: Implementation of NEP 2020

The speaker briefed about the NEP 2020 and suggested the different ways of implementing the same. He recommended that by protecting the basic subjects, multidisciplinary courses and research should be promoted in the college. They helped in raising the bar in higher education by encouraging the faculty to set goals and taking action steps towards our preparedness for NAAC. He advised all the staff to enhance their skills and be prepared for the implementation of NEP. They discussed all the key indicators of every Criterion and valid suggestions were conveyed to the Management.

#### **REPORT: Day-1 (22-06-23):**

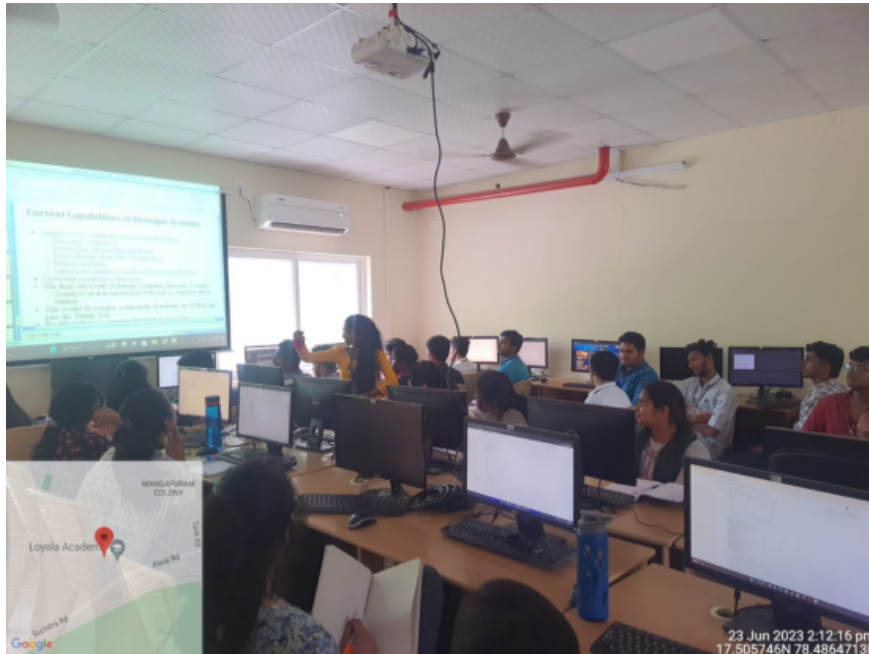

### **OBJECTIVE OF THE WORKSHOP:**

Neuro-linguistic programming studies the connection between neurological processes, language, and behavioral patterns acquired through experience. It aims to model excellence by identifying and replicating the mental strategies used by top performers.

### **ABOUT THE WORKSHOP:**

The four-day workshop was held on 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup> June and 1<sup>st</sup> of July. This workshop was organized for the final year students of B A Psychology, English & Journalism, around 51 students actively participated in this workshop. On the inaugural day, Father Bosco, the facilitator, provided an overview of Neuro-Linguistic Programming and how he had leveraged it in his own life to aid himself and others. He recounted an anecdote of a woman he had encountered on a train who was in severe headache-induced distress and weeping. Upon Father Bosco offering assistance, the woman assented. He instructed her to close her eyes and locate the source of her pain. Upon confirming she could visualize the pain, he proceeded to ask her a series of questions regarding the image's proximity, color, brightness and size. Following her responses, Father Bosco guided her to gradually move the image away until it disappeared completely, at which point her headache had also ceased.

Father Bosco then encouraged the participants to have an in-depth discussion amongst themselves about the anecdote he had shared, after which they would report their thoughts. He then guided the workshop attendees through performing the same visualization exercise as the woman on the train. Several participants found the technique to be useful and effective, reporting shifts in their mood and mental state. Specifically, some noted that after visualizing and metaphorically distancing their pain or discomfort, they experienced a reduction in those negative feelings.

On the second day of the workshop, Father Bosco discussed inferiority complexes and how individuals can overcome them to develop self-confidence. He posited that regularly practicing the visualization exercise from the previous day could aid in resolving inferiority complexes through repetition. Father Bosco then spoke about the process of concept formation, specifically how individuals construct an internal reality or prototype of a concept through repeated exposure. This internal prototype then shapes perceptions, attitudes and behaviors related to that concept. By visualizing oneself as confident and competent, one can begin to

form a more positive internal prototype that in turn fosters more confident attitudes and behaviors over time. The repetition of the visualization exercise was meant to facilitate this process of concept formation regarding confidence and self-worth.

On the third day of the workshop, Father Bosco discussed how Neuro-Linguistic Programming differs fundamentally from conventional fields of psychology. He noted that NLP focuses on cognitive structures and learned behavior, positing that any behavior or habit can be acquired or replicated through observation and modeling. As an example, Father Bosco recounted the story of a smoker he had counseled who wanted to quit. Through regularly practicing the visualization exercise, the smoker was eventually able to "unlearn" the smoking habit and ultimately quit. A key aspect of the workshop I appreciated was the freedom Father Bosco gave participants to discuss and share experiences amongst ourselves, an uncommon practice that enhanced learning and knowledge exchange. The interactive discussions complemented Father Bosco's presentations and case studies, providing a more holistic and impactful workshop experience.

On the final day of the workshop, the discussion centered on anchoring, a concept similar to classical conditioning. Father Bosco explained that throughout life, individuals develop anchors or associations between feelings, memories and behaviors/sensations. These feelings and memories can then be evoked whenever the corresponding stimulus is encountered. He posited that this anchoring process could be harnessed to cope with difficult experiences by accessing stimuli associated with positive feelings or memories during stressful times. However, Father Bosco cautioned that this technique was ineffective for managing traumatic experiences. According to him, anchoring works best for everyday stresses and challenges rather than severe psychological distress. To illustrate anchoring, Father Bosco provided examples of how certain smells, objects or places evoke particular memories and emotions in us due to the associations we form through life experiences. While anchoring could be a useful coping strategy, it is not a replacement for professional therapeutic interventions for complex mental health issues.

The workshop concluded with a meditation exercise aimed at overcoming feelings of anxiety. Father Bosco wrote the alphabet on the board and labeled each letter with either 'L' for left, 'R' for right, or 'T' for together. He then instructed participants to raise the corresponding hand (left, right or both together) as they read through the alphabet. This exercise was meant to relieve anxiety through engaging both hemispheres of the brain.

## **OUTCOME:**

Overall, the workshop provided useful techniques for coping with distress and emotional pain, particularly in dealing with inferiority complexes. The visualization exercises, anchoring concepts and discussions around concept formation were impactful learning experiences. In the end, Father Bosco invited feedback from participants, concluding what had been a thought-provoking and practical four days.

The students were able to see how the Arduino board was programmed to collect data from the LEDs, and how the data was then transmitted to a cloud-based platform for analysis. She also showed a video on the applications of IoT in our day to day lives which included advanced devices like robots, cars controlled by sensors, object identifiers etc.

Overall, the lecture was an insightful and engaging experience for the students. It provided them with a deeper understanding of the importance of Arduino and how it is emerging with other technologies. The practical demonstration of creating an IoT-enabled device with a virtual Arduino board and LEDs was particularly impressive, and it gave the students a taste of what it is like to work with IoT in a real-world setting. The students were provided with their own kits on which they performed certain mini projects which equipped their understanding. According to the students, they gained a comprehensive understanding of real-life applications by performing projects with several sensors like temperature and some important components like potentiometers. They were inspired to do their own projects on Arduino technology. This experience has equipped them with a strong skill set that will prove valuable in their future roles as electrical engineers.

**Outcome:**

In conclusion, the lecture on IoT was an enlightening and valuable experience for the students, and it has sparked a renewed interest in the field of IoT among many of them. The workshop ended with a valedictory.

The Wonderful session ended with the felicitation of Mrs. Sushma, Head Department of Electronics, ST. FRANCIS College for women with a Memento by the HOD of B.Sc. Computer Science and Internet of Things, Dr. Radhika concluded with the vote of thanks. Few

group photos were taken with the students and staff as a mark of respect.

All the students as well as the staff members have given a positive feedback towards the Lecturer as well as her way of teaching which was informative and interactive and also her insights on IOT were very helpful for all the students. As new students in this technology, we believe that her experiences and suggestions would lead us to become better future developers in this blooming industry. The practical session introduced all the students to the basics of Arduino, which was a unique experience for all. All the students and staff members are very grateful to her for precious time and help; which she provided for the students to get a clear and concise idea on Arduino.

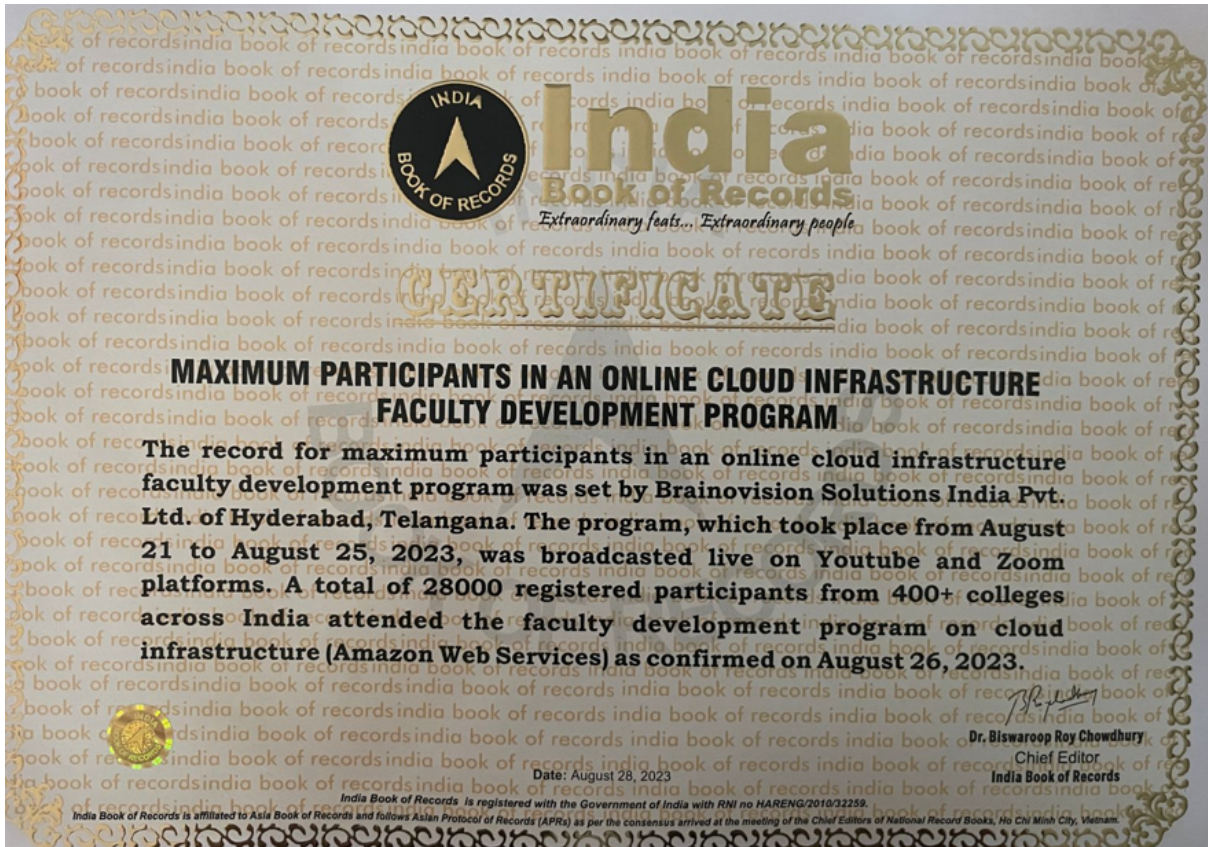

## DATA FISSION 3.0

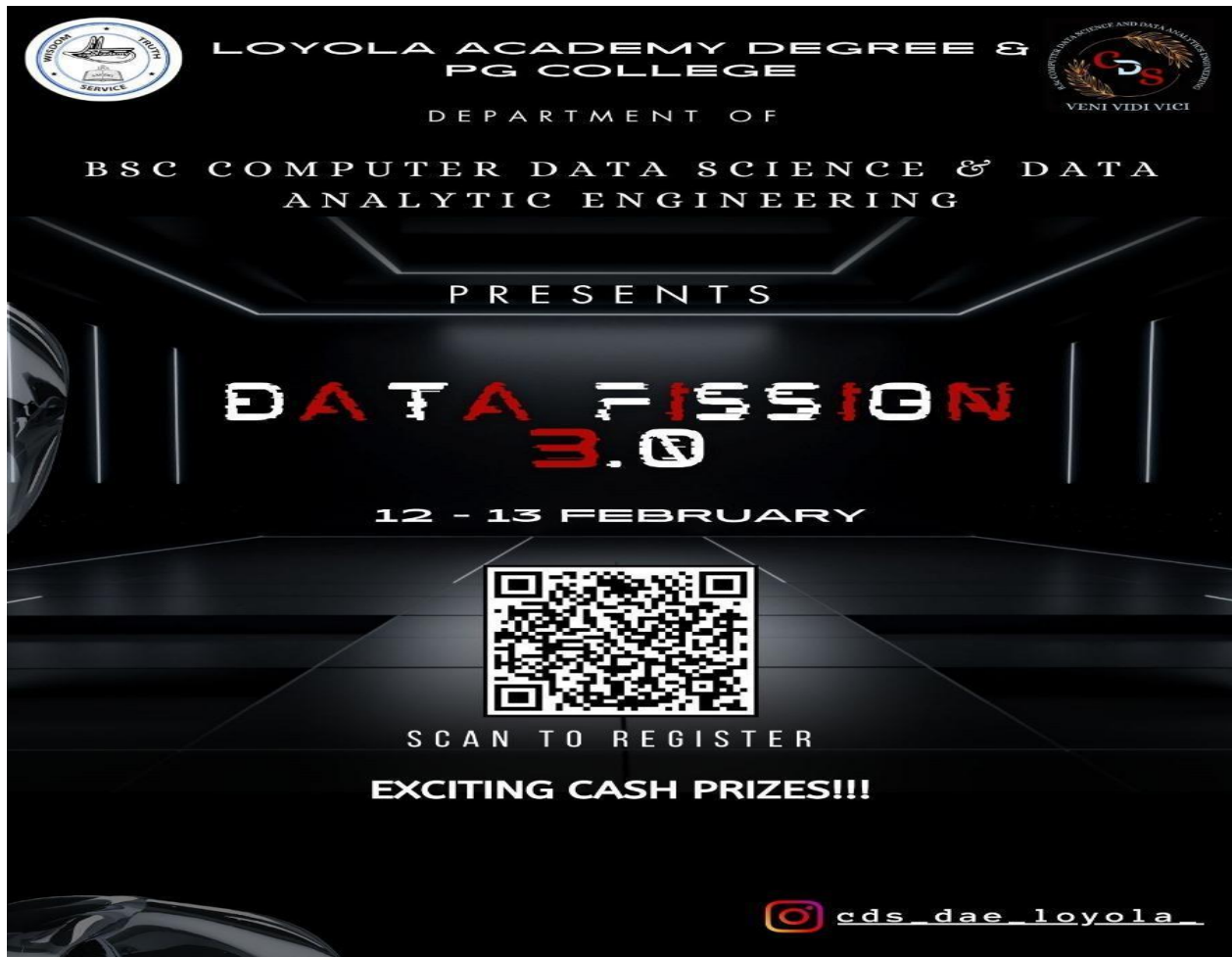
**Purpose:** To draw meaningful insights from the guest lectures and enhance the students with the knowledge they need for the course and to help them improve their coding skills.

Concurrently, in the Seminar Hall, an Alumni Meet was organized, featuring esteemed speakers from diverse professional backgrounds.

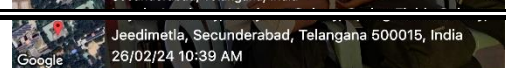
