Internship Overview: Loyola Degree and PG College, December 2024- January 2025

In **December 2024 -January 2025**, VOICE 4 Girls welcomed 56 interns from Loyola Degree College to support various programs. These students served in two primary roles: Field Coordinators and Counsellors.

- **Field Coordinators (15 students):** Field Coordinators managed logistics at camp locations, monitored sessions, and conducted preparatory meetings for fellow interns.
- **Counsellors (41 students):** Counsellors acted as representatives of VOICE 4 Girls, delivering essential information to adolescents and empowering them with the knowledge needed to make informed decisions about their futures.

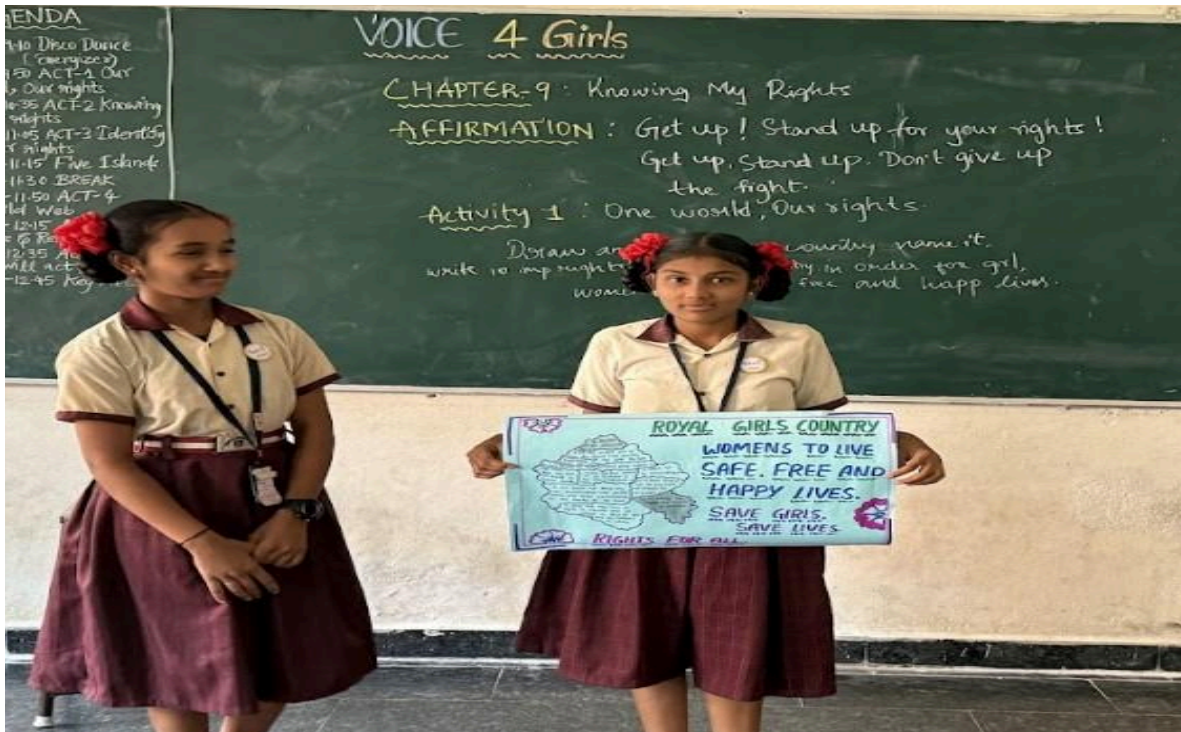

They receive training on leadership skills and are enabled to teach younger girls in their school about topics such as safe and unsafe touch, importance of education, support system, and basic health and wellbeing. The adolescents after completing this module are well-equipped to create a ripple of change by developing agency and become leaders that reach out into their communities as changemakers. 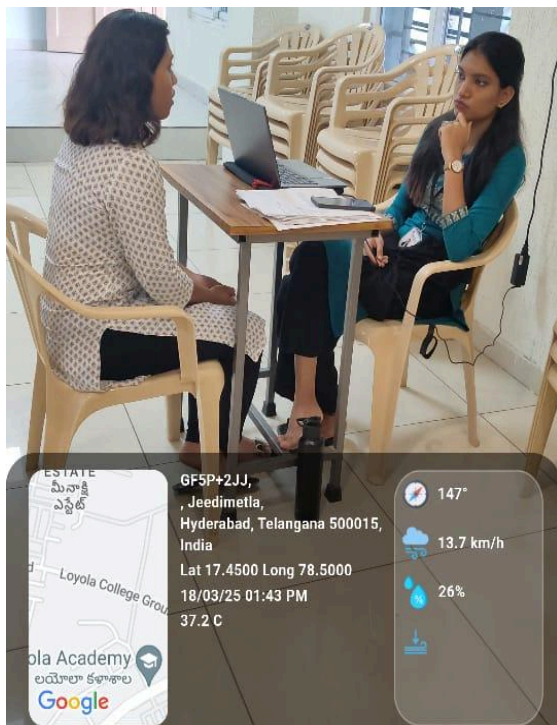
