**1. Introduction**

The college instated **1T NAVAL NCC SECUNDRABAD GROUP ANDHRAPADESH & TELANGANA DIRECTORATE** on 18th October 2021. The 1 batch for the period 2021-2024 was recruited on 5th November 2021 & the second batch for the period 2022-2025 was recruited in 24th October.

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) is the youth organization of the Indian Armed Forces, with its headquarters in New Delhi. The NCC was established in 1948 and its origin can be traced to the University Corps, which was created under the Indian Defence Act 1917 to overcome the shortage of personnel in the Army.

The NCC emblem has three colours: red, dark blue, and light blue, representing the Indian Army, Indian Navy, and Indian Air Force respectively. The 17 lotuses in the emblem represent the 17 NCC Directorates across the country.

In the Naval Wing of NCC, cadets are trained mainly in naval subjects such as seamanship, navigation, boat pulling, sailing, and ship modelling. Naval cadets learn the basics of the sea, maritime discipline, and watermanship. Activities like boat pulling and sailing help develop teamwork, coordination, and physical fitness.

**Boat Pulling** is an important training activity in the Naval Wing of the National Cadet Corps. It is the practice of rowing a boat using oars by a team of cadets. This activity is usually done in groups where each cadet pulls an oar while following the commands of a leader called the coxswain.

Boat pulling helps cadets develop teamwork, discipline, coordination, and physical strength. All cadets must row together in the same rhythm to move the boat smoothly and quickly. The coxswain gives commands such as “Give way together” and “Hold water” to control the movement and speed of the boat.

This training also improves watermanship skills, balance, and confidence while working on water. It teaches cadets how to handle boats safely and effectively. Boat pulling competitions are also conducted during NCC camps where teams compete to reach the finish line in the shortest time.

Overall, boat pulling is an important part of Naval NCC training, helping cadets build leadership, cooperation, endurance, and maritime skills.



**Sailing** in National Cadet Corps (NCC) Navy Wing is one of the most exciting and practical activities cadets get to experience. It focuses on learning how to operate sailboats using wind power, along with teamwork, discipline, and water safety.

## **2. Annual Training Camp - VIII**

Secunderabad group achieved overall 1st position in IGC-RDC 2025.



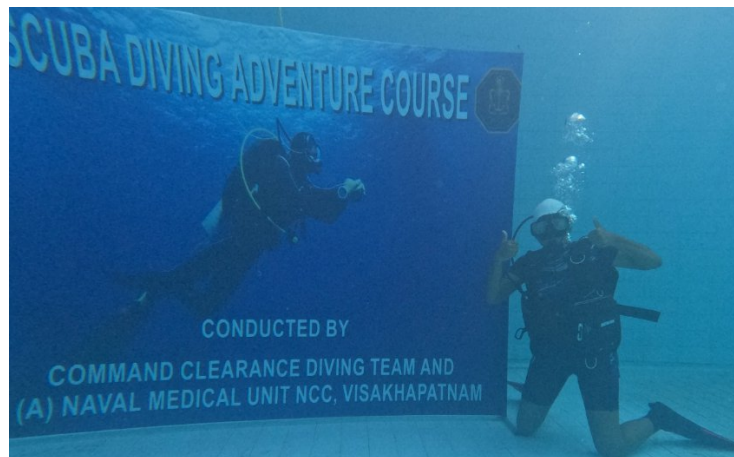
### **23. Scuba Diving Camp**
