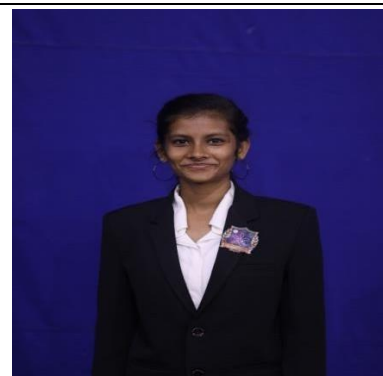

Later the group photo of all participants with their posters were taken. Posters were appreciated by the father's and respected judges.



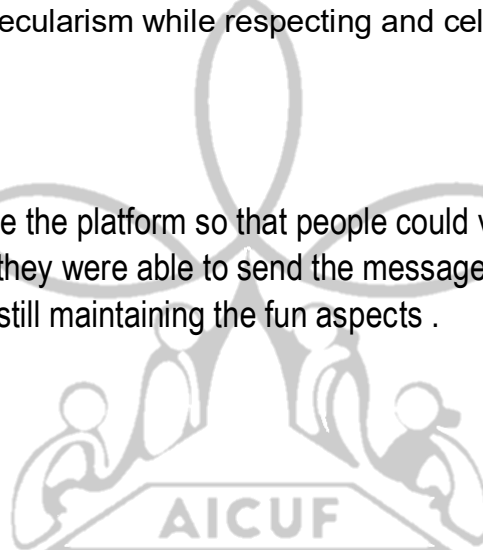

The court room drama was a mock trial based on "KARNATAKA HIJAB CASE"

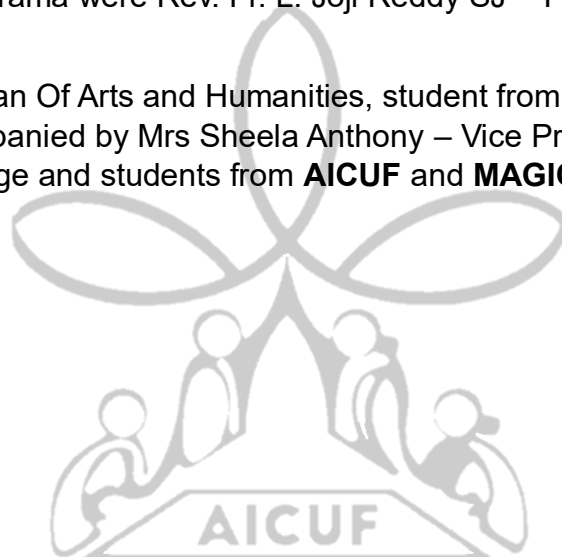

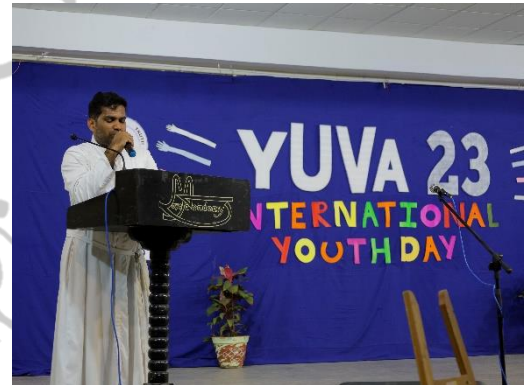

It emphasizes the importance of ensuring that girls have access to sanitary pads and teaching them about the concepts of "**good touch**" and "**bad touch**." This day serves as a reminder to empower girls with knowledge, support, and protection, ensuring their physical and emotional well-being.

## 2. Sharada Vidyabhavan High School-Shapur Nagar:

Upon the arrival of the committee members at **Sharada Vidyabhavan High School** at **11:30a.m**. The interaction session with the girl students started by an opportunity to educate and empower young girls with knowledge that can help them lead safe, healthy, and fulfilling lives.



### Interactive Sessions:

During the session, the members discussed the importance of recognizing and reporting any form of inappropriate physical contact. Examples and guidance were provided how to distinguish between touches. Girls were educated about their rights and the importance of speaking up against any form of violence within their homes or in their communities. They were encouraged to seek support from teachers, counsellors, or helplines if they or someone they know is facing domestic violence. The members discussed the significance of **menstrual hygiene**, how to manage periods, and the physical and emotional changes that come with it. Girls were informed about the importance of using clean and safe menstrual hygiene products and the need to address period-related discomfort without shame.

## 3. Sri Aditya High School-Jeedimetla:
